Leading Possibilities Mentioned For Kennedy's Secretary of State

Washington—(UPI)—Rep. Chester Bowles, Sen. J. William Fulbright and ex-ambassador David Bruce were reported today to be leading possibilities for secretary of state in the Kennedy administration.

Although President-elect John F. Kennedy doesn't plan to announce his cabinet selections until after Thanksgiving or later, speculation was widespread on his probable choices for top government posts.

Bowles, who is retiring from Congress, was a foreign policy adviser to Kennedy in the presidential campaign. Fulbright is chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee and Bruce is a former ambassador to Germany.

Seen Out of Running

Adlai E. Stevenson, often mentioned as a possible secretary of state, is believed to be out of the running now. But he is reported to be under con-

sideration as U.S. ambassador to the United Nations.

Here is the speculation of other cabinet posts:

Defense—Speculation centers around Thomas K. Finletter, former Air Force secretary; Dan Kimball, former Navy secretary; Frank Pace, former Army secretary, and Sen. Stuart Symington (D-Mo.), another former Air Force secretary.

Treasury—Names being mentioned include Jesse W. Tapp, chairman of the Bank of America in San Francisco, and George W. Mitchell, vice president, Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago.

Commerce—Gov. Luther Hodges of North Carolina is a possibility.

Health, education and welfare—G. Mennen Williams, outgoing governor of Michigan, apparently is a leading candidate.

Attorney general—Gov. Abraham Ribicoff, an early Kennedy supporter, is the center of speculation. Another name being mentioned is former football star Byron "Whizzer" White, a Denver attorney and prominent in Kennedy's campaign.

Agriculture—Gov. Herschel C. Loveless of Iowa, Gov. Orville Freeman of Minnesota, Gov. Gaylord Nelson of Wisconsin. Loveless lost in his attempt to become senator from Iowa, and Freeman was defeated for reelection as Minnesota governor. Nelson was reelected in Wisconsin.

Interior—Gov. Stephen L. McNichols of Colorado.

Other possibilities are Rep. Stewart L. Udall (D-Ariz.) and Sen. Clair Engle (D-Calif.).

Labor—Some speculation says a major political figure may get the job, such as New

York Mayor Robert F. Wagner. Another possibility is Archibald Cox, a Harvard law professor and Kennedy's "brain trust" adviser on labor matters. A labor name being mentioned is Arthur J. Goldberg, special AFL-CIO counsel.

Democrats Will Control Oregon Senate 20 to 10; House 31 to 29

Salem—(UPI)—The 1961 legislature will be controlled by Democrats 20-10 in the Senate and 31-29 in the House, meaning the majority party increased its hold on the upper house but the Republicans made inroads in the lower chamber.

Democrats controlled the 1959 session 19-11 in the Senate and 33-27 in the House. The Democrats picked up their one more Senate seat in Josephine county. Democrat

E. D. (Debbs) Potts, mayor of Grants Pass, overturned Fayette I. Bristol, GOP state representative who was House Republican floor leader in the 1959 session.

All but one member of the 1961 Senate, Potts, have had legislative experience.

John Hare (R-Hillsboro) was the only Republican to win a contest for senator. Sen. Anthony Yturri (R-Ontario) Senate minority leader last year, was re-elected without opposition.

An expected tussle for Senate president is developing between Harry Boivin (D-Klamath Falls) and Alfred Corbett (D-Portland).

Some 44 members of the new 60-member House are incumbents or former legislators. Seven 1959 representatives, including four Republicans, were dumped in bids for re-election.

They were Republicans Earl Hill of Cushing, W. W. Chadwick, Salem, Evelyn Nye of

Medford and Ed Oakes of Ontario, and Democrats Verne Cady of Burns, Carl Yancey of Klamath Falls and Roy Fitzwater, Lebanon, Hill was a veteran of eight sessions.

Democratic State Reps. Al Flegel of Roseburg and Vernon Cook of Troutdale moved up to the Senate. Cook was defeated in last May's primary for the Senate nomination in Multnomah county but he got on the ballot after Democratic candidate Le W Wallace died suddenly.

Two House members openly interested in the speaker position are Robert Duncan (D-Medford), speaker in 1959, and W. H. Holmstrom (D-Gearhart).

The two-vote edge for the Democrats in the House may make it tough for them to operate as they like because a few Democrats often cross

over and vote with the Republicans.
