Miss Signoret announced last week she will seek a divorce from her husband, writer Arthur Miller.

She and Montand starred in the movie "Let's Make Love," in Hollywood earlier this year. Both later denied reports they had become romantically interested in each other. Montand last week declined to discuss Miss Signoret's divorce plans.

Feels Sorry - Miss Signoret, in London for a television appearance, said she felt sorry for Miss Monroe.

"If she is in love with my husband, it proves she has good taste," she said. "I'm in love with him too."

"Marilyn Monroe is a warm, delightful person. I lived with her for three months."

She declined to say whether Miss Monroe had come between her and Montand.

Tuesday a lecture will be given for the benefit of SOC students at 10 a.m. and at 3 p.m. there will be another demonstration workshop for Ashland teachers of grades four, five, and six. John Cady and Miss Aileen Inlow will take their fifth grade classes from Walker school to serve as demonstration groups.

Egbert is vice president of the American Music conference and his appearance in Ashland is under the auspices of that organization. He will be honored by teachers from the public schools and the college at a no-host dinner to night at 6:30 o'clock in the Mark Anthony hotel.

The accident occurred on North Main st., police said. Mrs. Wagar was thrown from the car. The accident occurred at 7:25 p.m. Saturday, according to police reports.

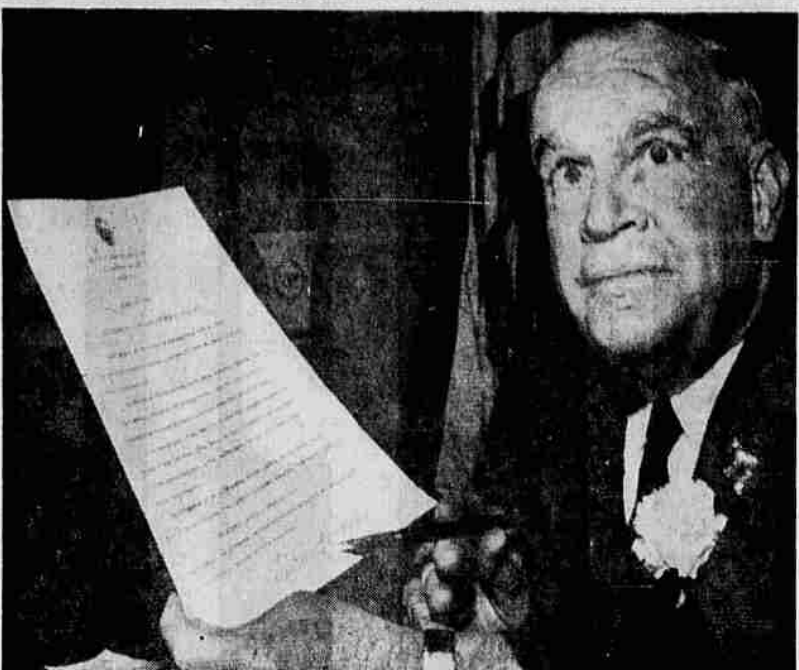

Prolonged Applause Given Musicians

The chorus and orchestra of the Philharmonic Society of Southern Oregon presented the first concert of the 1960-61 season Sunday, and the reaction of the good-sized audience must have been a source of great satisfaction to Director R. D. Werner and the musicians.

At the end of the concert

there was prolonged and vigorous applause, including a number of hearty "bravos" and at length the audience rose, continuing the applause. We cannot remember such a response to a Philharmonic concert before.

The applause was due in part, of course, to the nature of the program, and in part to the able manner in which the music had been performed. The program opened with the first performance of a new composition by Director Werner, which was very well received, and the final highlight was Rossini's "Stabat Mater" (which may be translated as "Sorrowing Mother"). This sacred cantata has some very beautiful and exciting music, and it evoked a warm response. It is sung in Latin.
