Traditional Grid Rivalries Slated on Coming Week End

Traditional rivalries and battles to preserve perfect records by the four remaining major colleges top next week end's football schedule, but the bowl picture won't be completed for still another week.

While Missouri, Washington, Arkansas, Mississippi and Florida are virtual shoo-ins for berths in the major bowl games, the identity of most of the visiting teams remains to be decided when the Southwest and Southeastern conferences conclude their seasons Nov. 26.

Overpowering Missouri—the only unbeaten and untied team in the top ten—aims to make Kansas its 10th consecutive victim this Saturday and clinch the Big Eight crown, a trip to the Orange Bowl, and possibly the national championship.

Wallop Oklahoma

The second-ranked Tigers stunned Oklahoma, 41-19, last Saturday for their first triumph over the Sooners in 15 years.

With Washington set as the "host" for the Rose Bowl game again, its opponent apparently will be decided this week end between either Minnesota or Iowa of the Big Ten.

The first-ranked Gophers attempt to rebound from their 23-14 defeat by Purdue against Wisconsin, while Iowa, ranked No. 6, plays Notre Dame, loser of seven straight. The Big Ten title is also at stake with Minnesota needing a victory to tie for the lead. The Hawkeyes tripped third-ranked Ohio State, 35-12, last Saturday.

Ole Miss, ranked No. 4, remained unbeaten and kept its lead in the Southeastern conference by trouncing Tennessee, 24-3. The Rebels, all set for the Sugar Bowl, meet Mississippi State this week end.

From Southwest

Mississippi's rival in the classic is expected to come from the Southwestern conference as is Florida's rival in the Gator Bowl. Texas, Baylor and Rice appear to be the leading candidates to fill these berths.

Seventh-ranked Arkansas is the logical choice for the Cotton Bowl, with Alabama and Tennessee, of the Southeastern conference or Navy as a possible opponent.

The Razorbacks beat Southern Methodist, 26-3, last Saturday and play Texas Tech in their finale. Duke, leader in the Atlantic Coast conference, is expected to be Arkansas' rival in the Cotton classic. The Blue Devils defeated Wake Forest, 34-7, last week end.

Yale, Utah and New Mexico State, the other remaining teams with clean slates, run up against arch-rivals this Saturday. The Elis, who have clinched a tie for the Ivy league crown by defeating Princeton, 35-22, last Saturday, play Harvard. Utah State meets Utah, and New Mexico State clashes with Hardin-Simmons.

Huskies Win Title

In other top games last week, Washington captured the Big Five title with a 27-1 victory over California; Navy and Joe Bellino ran all over Virginia, 41-6; Pittsburgh tied Army, 7-7; Syracuse downed Colgate, 41-6; Auburn beat Georgia, 9-6; and Florida dropped Tulane, 21-6.

The Orangemen, the Mid-dies and Pitt are possibilities for "home" berths in New York's Gotham Bowl and Philadelphia's Liberty Bowl.

Syracuse, last year's national champion, meets Miami, a 28-21 victor over Notre Dame last week end. Pitt plays Penn State Saturday and Navy is idle, awaiting its annual tussle with Army.

Mississippi Humbles Vols

Knoille — (UPI) — Bowl-bound Mississippi shattered the Tennessee defenses with deadly passing by quarterback Jake Gibbs and powerful running by fullback Jim Anderson Saturday for a 24 to 3 victory, the first ever achieved by the Rebels on the Tennessee home grounds.

Fourth-ranked Mississippi, now 8-0-1 for the season, handed Tennessee its second defeat in a row with cool efficiency.

Erdelatz' Enthusiasm Rubs Off

San Francisco — (UPI) — Eddie Erdelatz, coach of the struggling Oakland Raiders, stood in the locker room doorway Sunday afternoon with a broad grin on his beefy face.

And he had a good reason, for his "victory desire" had rubbed off onto his rag tag group of pros.

"The guys knew they had to win this game," Eddie said after posting a 20-7 triumph over the Buffalo Bills in a rugged American Football league joust. "And they went out and did it. They had that desire."

This was the Erdelatz of College years talking — the coaching genius whose infective enthusiasm made Navy into a power house.

The Raiders, hitting like a French 75 in liquid form or otherwise, climbed out of the western division cellar while working over the Bills before a crowd of 8,800 at Kezar stadium.

And the club had something else — shifty Tony Teressa who had been coaching high school football in his native Salinas then decided to return to action this season.

82-Yard Touchdown

The 25-year-old halfback, who starred as a quarterback at San Jose State five seasons ago, got off an 83 yard touchdown run against the Bills and also set up Larry Barnes' second field goal with a 33 yard pass to Alan Goldstein.

"We caught Buffalo in a certain type of defense we were expecting them to use and that's how we sprang Tony loose," Erdelatz said. "Yes, I think we've been improving with each game. And our pass defense was better after we made several changes among our deep backs."

John Green, who flung four touchdown passes at the Raiders on Oct. 23 while the Bills were tramping them, 39-8, in Buffalo, clicked on only 14 out of 32 tosses Sunday for 133 yards. He had amassed 378 yards in the air against Oakland in their earlier game.

And a solid defense, headed by Riley Morris, rushed Green badly on occasions. On others, the former Chattanooga University star saw his perfect losses dropped by receivers who were in something of a slump.

Clarence Peaks Lost By Eagles

Philadelphia — (UPI) — Fullback Clarence Peaks, enjoying his best year in professional football, was lost to the Philadelphia Eagles for the remainder of the season today because of a broken leg.

Peaks suffered a fracture of the fibula just above the ankle of his right leg in the second period of Sunday's 19-13 Eagle victory over the Washington Redskins here.

Chairman Says Politics Wrecked Gold Cup Races

Las Vegas, Nev. — (UPI) — Seattle and Detroit opened spirited bidding today to get the 1981 Gold Cup races for their cities.

But conspicuous by its absence in the bidding was Las Vegas.

This gambling city figures it "got took" by the hydro-plane racers who refused to compete on the choppy waters of Lake Mead on either Saturday or Sunday — thus forcing cancellations of the event and disappointing tens of thousands of spectators who had flocked to the shores of the lake. They waited in vain from early morning to late afternoon for some action.

The drivers and owners blamed winds of 15 to 30 miles an hour that put tiny white caps on the waves of the man-made lake.

Different Idea

But Bob Cardinal, race chairman and president of the Lake Mead Cup association, had a different idea.

"We were killed by politics among the drivers and owners," said Cardinal. "The drivers who went out early were afraid the drivers who got a later starting time would have the advantage; or the late starters were afraid the early men to start would get the help of calmer waters."

Old Pros' Gambles Pay Off in Wins

The "old pro" quarterbacks gambled and won. And that's why the Baltimore Colts, Philadelphia Eagles and New York Giants have an edge today in the race for the National Football league championship.

Johnny Unitas of the Colts, Norm Van Brocklin of the Eagles and "Good Old Charlie" Conerly of the Giants took a chance that paid off in victory, when failure would have meant a serious setback in the pressure-packed battle for the pro title.

Unitas passed up a chance for a field goal, and on fourth down with 14 yards to go he threw a 39-yard touchdown pass to Lenny Moore with 42 seconds left on the clock to give Baltimore a 24-20 victory over the Chicago Bears.

Seventh Try Good

Van Brocklin, frustrated by six straight incomplete passes, faded back for a seventh try on fourth down with 8 to go and connected on a 28-yard touchdown toss to Bobby Watson in the final period as the Eagles rallied for a 19-13 victory over the Washington Redskins.

And Conerly, who is 39, slow of foot and risks life and limb every time he carries the ball, broke loose for runs of 12 and 16 yards to set up Pat Summerall's 37-yard field goal which gave the Giants a 27-24 win over the Pittsburgh Steelers.

Summerall's kick was made with 30 seconds left to play.

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Tom Fears' Hat Fails As Charm

Detroit — (UPI) — Tom Fears, presently employed as end coach of the Los Angeles Rams, was out looking for a new hat today.

Fears, a former great on the team and a member of the world championship squad of 1951, punched a hole through his old hat Sunday. The bonnet had failed him.

Actually Fears' chapeau was far from ancient. In fact, it was just about a month old. He had picked it up just before the Rams tied the Chicago Bears in their National Football league game at Los Angeles, and claimed the hat was "lucky."

It may have been at that. The Rams, losers of 12 NFL games in succession over a two year span, suddenly sprang to life. After their tie with the Bears, they won two in a row over the Detroit Lions and Dallas Cowboys. Fears wouldn't let anybody near the hat.

But the lovely acquaintance between Tom and his toppler fell flat Sunday. The "magic" wore off and the Rams lost to the Lions 12-10 before a capacity crowd of 54,019 in Briggs Stadium. Fears vented his feelings and the hat at the same time by punching a hole in it.

Fears' action probably summed up the feelings of the whole Ram squad — frustration and disgust.

After scoring 48 points against Detroit two weeks ago and then another 38 against the Cowboys last Sunday, the Rams had to wait until the final quarter to push over their lone touchdown of the game.

Before that score Los Angeles was almost helpless, as the Lions broke the Ram backs and spirits with a 98-yard touchdown drive in the third quarter.

It wasn't a day for the Rams — hat or no hat.

With the score knotted 3-3 quarterback Billy Wade had the Rams on the march. But the drive ended just two yards away from completion when Wade fumbled after a keeper play, and Detroit recovered on its own two.

New York — (UPI) — Going as fast as is humanly possible, whether on land or on sea, is a matter of "compulsion" with Donald Campbell.

Campbell holds the world speedboat record of 260 miles per hour. And he was merely winding up at 365 miles per hour on the Bonneville salt flats this year in his aim to reach 425 or even 500 miles per hour with an automobile.

Then he flipped.

Why? Simply compulsion. Back in 1898 a 12-year-old youngster later to become famous first as a speed demon and later as Sir Malcolm Campbell bicycled madly down a hill in his native Chislehurst, England, near London, with his hands in his pockets.

Young Malcolm was haled into court and fined 10 shillings for "furious riding."

"And," the magistrate lectured sternly, "let this be a lesson to you, Malcolm Campbell, not to go so fast in the future."

It was a wasted admonition. In Father's Footsteps

The daredevil bicyclist went on to set land and water speed records — and stamp the imprint of his yearning for speed on the soul of his young, handsome son.

Thus it was that Donald Campbell came back to the salt flats this year in another of those famous family "Bluebirds" in search of a new record. And, strangely enough, lived to tell about it.

Out at Bonneville they have an eight-mile stretch to wind it up for the measured mile through which the mechanical monsters are driven like a shaft of light. Donald, a short and slender man with a happy sense of humor, flew the Bluebird through the first mile and a half of that windup at 365 miles per hour. He still had six and a half miles to go before he hit the measured mile. But then he struck a soft spot.

Eighty-six manufacturers had sunk \$4,500,000 into that newest of the Bluebirds. It had taken five years to put it together. The tires had been researched to the tune of \$1,000,000.

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Single Seat Race Car Event Next Sunday
Hollywood, Calif. — Interest on the West Coast is building for the Sunday, Nov. 20 running of the world championship for single seat race cars at the Riverside International raceway, Riverside, Calif.
