Juvenile Offenders Suggestion Made

Salem -UPI- The Oregon Association of Municipal Judges has recommended to the 1981 Oregon Legislature that jurisdiction over juvenile traffic offenders be returned to the traffic courts.

The traffic offenders, under 18, now are handled in Juvenile Court, although most, the association said, are being remanded to municipal, district and justice courts for disposition.

Salem -UPI- Canada Thistle, wild morning glory, quackgrass, tansy ragwort, Russian Knapweed, White-Top and Gorse.

These plants, in order, are the biggest weed pests in Oregon, the Oregon Weed conference has been told.

George Moose of the Oregon Agriculture Department said the state is continuing to battle ragweed, the hay fever menace, and 7,000 acres were controlled this year.
