OSC Gets Grant To Continue Math, Science Training

Corvallis - A fifth quarter-million-dollar grant has been given Oregon State college by the National Science Foundation to continue special institute training for U. S. high school science and mathematics teachers.

OSC has been one of the national leaders in the science-math teacher training program since it was launched by NSF in 1956. The new grant of \$285,900 for 1961-62 work was announced by President A. L. Strand.

The grant will be used to support a number of academic-year institutes for 45 selected teachers from across the nation. The institutes are designed to help teachers improve their subject matter knowledge, to upgrade science and math training in U. S. high schools, and to increase the nation's supply of top quality scientists and teachers.

Director of the program at OSC is Dr. Stanley E. Williamson, head of the science education department. One of 16 Colleges

OSC was one of only 16 colleges initially picked to start the special institutes in 1956 and has been on the select list each year since then. Next year, 43 colleges will offer the institutes for some 1,600 teachers.

Each of the teachers picked to attend an institute will receive \$3,000 plus allowances for dependents, books and travel. Teachers are enrolled in the graduate school and pursue especially planned science and math courses.

Teachers must have taught for at least three years before they are eligible to apply for the training. Information about the institute program and colleges giving the training will be made available to all U.S. high school teachers. Williamson said. Interested teachers may then apply directly to the college they wish to attend. Applications will be received until Jan. 20, 1961.

Twenty-one states are represented among this year's group of teachers at OSC. In addition to the academic-year institute, OSC also conducts a series of special summer programs each year for the National Science Foundation.

Two Americans Sentenced in France

Bordeaux, France - UPI - A French court Wednesday sentenced two Americans to five years in prison each for robbing a U.S. Army armored car of \$20,000.

Percy Cocksey, 26, a native of St. Louis, Mo., and Richard Gerard White, 25, of Detroit, Mich., were jailed with two Frenchmen for the payroll theft near Bordeaux last February.

U. S. Population Hits 182 Million

Washington - UPI - The U.S. population reached 182 million at about 2 a.m. (PST) today, the Census Bureau estimated.

It based the calculation on results of this year's population count and birth, death, and migration rates. The nation's population stood at a record of 179,323,179 on April 1.

Influencing the population total are rates for births, one every 7 1/2 seconds, deaths, one every 20 seconds, the arrival of an immigrant every 1 1/2 minutes, and the departure of an emigrant every 23 minutes.

Their net results is that the U.S. population grows by an average of one person every 1 1/2 seconds.
