

Jobless Claims Higher Than 1957

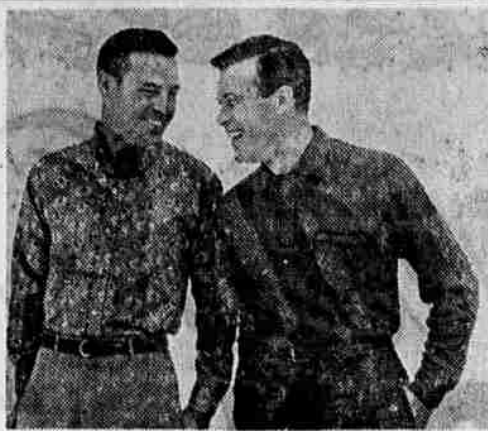
Salem — UPI — Oregon Employment Commissioner David H. Cameron said Wednesday unemployment compensation claims in the first two weeks of November were higher than for the comparable period of the 1957 recession year.

Initial claims totaled 14,735 compared to 11,692 for the first two weeks of November, 1957. In 1959 the figure was 6,884.

Total initial claims for October, 1960 were 21,990 compared to 23,380 for October, 1957 but greater than October last year. Then it was 12,239 new claims.

Payments for the current fiscal year, through Nov. 18, were up to \$6,648,537 compared to \$3,999,778 last year. The comparable figure for 1958 was \$8,930,182.

Oregon Supreme Court Decisions

Salem — UPI — The Oregon Supreme Court has affirmed the conviction of Charles Junior Hood of Klamath county on a charge of assault with a dangerous weapon. Hood was charged with beating the victim with a poker and a bottle during a drunken brawl.

William J. Baer, executor of the estate of Alice Baer, appellant vs. Julius L. Van Huffel and Nettie Van Huffel; appeal from Deschutes county; opinion of Justice William Perry; Judge E. H. Howell affirmed; directed verdict for the defendants in a wrongful death action after a woman guest fell down a basement stairway affirmed.

H. G. Lamoreaux vs. Lucille F. Lamoreaux, appellant; appeal from Walla Walla county; opinion by Justice Gordon Sloan; Judge W. F. Brownton reversed; decree granting a divorce to the husband reversed for insufficient evidence on appeal of the wife.

Irene May, executrix of the estate of Sterling May, appellant vs. Robert L. Mack and Julius A. Vanderwiele, administrators of the estate of Dewey Leonard Dunleavy; appeal from Baker county; opinion by Justice Pro Tem Dal King; Judge Lyle R. Wolff affirmed; wrongful death action involving a fatal car col-

lision near Baker, verdict for defendant affirmed.

Bud Bartley vs. John D. Doherty, appellant; appeal from Umatilla county; opinion by Justice Pro Tem Dal King; Judge William M. Wells affirmed; action by a farm laborer for injuries incurred on defendant's ranch near Pilot Rock, judgment for \$4,624 special damages and \$25,000 general damages affirmed.

Birdie Billings, appellant vs. State Industrial Accident Commission; appeal from Curry county; opinion by Justice Pro Tem E. H. Howell; Judge Belloni affirmed; industrial accident claim case, commission affirmed.

State vs. Richard Denton Holleman, appellant; appeal from Lane county; opinion by Justice Pro Tem E. H. Howell; Judge Alfred T. Goodwin affirmed; two cases both charging Holleman with contributing to delinquency of minors affirmed.

Anchor Petroleum Co., appellant vs. J. J. Buller; appeal from Yamhill county; opinion per curiam; Judge Arlie G. Walker affirmed; contract action for price of commercial propane gas delivered to a retailer in which the seller sought \$2,441, judgment of \$149 only affirmed.

New York — UPI — Dr. Werner von Braun, director of the U.S. space flight center in Huntsville, Ala., said Wednesday he felt the planned orbiting of an astronaut will be successful in 1961.

Von Braun, at a news conference, said the failure of a Project Mercury capsule launching at Wallops Island, Va., last Monday was a "slippage of a few weeks only" in the program to put a man in orbital flight.
