## Celts Back On Top in Cage Loop

 The Boston Celtics, once again playing as a champion should, are back in their accustomed first-place spot in the Eastern division of the National Basketball Association.

Boston utilized a 42-point second quarter to gain a 122-105 decision over the New York Knickerbockers Wednesday night. It was the fourth straight victory and the seventh in eight games for the Celtics, who are now leading Philadelphia in first place. The Celtics meet the Warriors at Philadelphia tonight.

Bill Russell led Boston in scoring with 25 points and Willie Naulls had 24 for the Knicks.

Oscar Robertson broke a Cincinnati record with 14 assists to lead the Royals to a 122-118 triumph over the Los Angeles Lakers and Elgin Baylor. The Big O also scored 31 points, with 15 of them coming in the second quarter. However, game point honors once again went to Baylor with 37.

In the only other NBA game, Detroit fought back from a 61-52 half-time deficit to beat the Syracuse Nationals, 122-115, and break a three-game losing streak.

Full 18 holes, as in the past, will be contested. Plus or minus points will be registered according to the number of holes a team is up or down at the end of the match. Teams are to make their own match dates, calling teams they have not played and not playing a team more than once.

Chairman Floyd Baker has asked that teams plan to play at least one match per week. Prize winning will be based on a minimum of 12 matches over the three months. There is no maximum limit. Winners will be determined by the best total plus scores. Teams ending in plus points will share in the kitty. Prizes will be merchandise certificates.

## Washington Dominates Statistics

San Francisco — (UPI) — The University of Washington and UCLA's Billy Kilmer dominated latest Big Five statistics released today.

The Huskies top the AAUW in four categories. They lead in total offense, 319 yards per game, rushing, 219 yards, rushing defense, 112, and scoring, 25.5 points.

The Bruins are close behind with leadership in defense, 261 yards, passing offense, 134 and scoring defense, 8.8.

The Huskies have finished their season, not counting a New Year's Rose Bowl date, but UCLA still has to face Utah and Duke so there could yet be a shakeup in the league's team statistics.

California won the pass defense crown by allowing 107 yards per game, but UCLA still has a chance at the title. Kilmer is making a shambles of the individual battle. He has totaled 1440 yards rushing and passing—441 more than runner-up Dick Norman of Stanford. And Kilmer still has two games to play.

Washington's George Fleming is tops in the scoring with 65 points. Gil Dowd of Stanford leads the rushers with 447 yards. Washington sophomore Charlie Mitchell and Kilmer are next at 478, but

again with two games to play, Kilmer is sure to walk away with the title.

Norman has completed 95 passes for 1037 yards to lead passers. Kilmer is ranked third with 55 completions. Stanford's Skip Face leads the receivers with 28 catches for 271 yards, closely followed by teammates Mac Wylie and Dale Ostrander.

As for punting, Kilmer again dominates with a 41.7 average on 31 kicks. But Jerry Scattini of Cal closed the season with a 41.6 mark, so Kilmer will have to keep kicking 'em far in the final two contests to keep that title.
