

# DAVID DOUGLAS A-1 GRID CHAMPS

Portland — (UPI) — David Douglas, using a strong running attack, scored two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to defeat North Salem, 34-20 in the Oregon high school Class A-1 football championship before 12,983 fans in Multnomah Stadium Friday night.

David Douglas, leading only 21-20 early in the fourth period, scored on a 7-yard pass from quarterback Terry DeSylvia to end Ed Attebury to cap a 61-yard, nine play drive and on a 51-yard run by halfback Dave Hansen.

Hansen was Douglas' leading ground gainer and scorer as he tallied two touchdowns and carried the ball 16 times for 209 of the winner's 331 yards rushing.

The Scots were never headed in the contest as they grabbed a 21-13 halftime lead and then clinched the game with the two fourth period scores.

David Douglas, winning its first state championship in the history of the school, scored the first two times it got the ball on sustained drives of 74 and 70 yards. Fullback Dan Lambert tallied from two yards out for the first touchdown and DeSylvia scored on a three-yard run to break a 7-7 tie and give the winners a lead they never relinquished.

The Vikings also scored the first time they got the ball with a 10-yard pass from quarterback Bill Mickle to end Robb Hoskins climaxing a 69-yard, 11 play scoring drive. Mickle accounted for all the loser's scores as he ran for

one touchdown and passed for two. He went 25 yards on a keeper in the second period to narrow the Douglas gap to 14-13 and passed a four-yard scoring aerial to halfback Dennis Allen in the third quarter.

Hansen, proving why he was David Douglas' leading ground gainer, this season, staked the winners to a 21-13 halftime lead when he scampered 27 yards for a touchdown.

The victory was the 11th in 12 games for the new state champions this season while it was North Salem's third loss against eight wins and a tie.

Eugene — (UPI) — Coach Len Casanova announced here Friday that Oregon will begin workouts on Dec. 5 for the Liberty Bowl against Penn State at Philadelphia Dec. 17.

Casanova said the Ducks would hold a squad meeting Nov. 28 and then start serious workouts the following week. The veteran Webfoot mentor added the squad will keep in condition in the meantime with each individual doing plenty of running on his own.

Oregon enters the Liberty Bowl game with a 7-2-1 record compared to 6-3 for Penn State. Penn State has defeated such teams as Army (27-26) and Pittsburgh (14-3).

Both coaches, Casanova of Oregon and Rip Engle of Penn State, will receive three game films of their opponents in action. Engle has requested films of Oregon's 7-6 loss to Washington, the easy 27-6 victory over Stanford and last week's 14-14 tie with Oregon State.

## Eagles Open Hoop Slate On Friday

There are seven lettermen on the Eagle Point squad. Seniors are Ron Greb, 6-4; Elvin Hawkins, 6 feet; Gary Ayres, 5-11; Mike Palm, 5-10, and Tom Perdue, 5-9. Junior monogram-wearers are Dick Wilson, 6 feet, and Steve Gerent, 6-10.

Others on Roster — Other seniors on the club are Wally West, 5-8; Bill Piefer, 5-11, and Bill Mor-

gan, 5-8, who is just recuperated from a toe fracture. Juniors also on the roster are Denny Chamberlain, 6-2, and Pat Meyer, 6 feet. Sophomores rounding out the squad are Charles Pomroy, 6 feet; Bill Hoeft, 6-1, and Randy Sikes, 5-9.

Senior Ron Weidman will not join the team until January. He suffered a hip fracture in football.

So far, Bates has emphasized fundamentals, conditioning and defense.

## Eugene Keeps Cage Meet Through 1962

Portland — (UPI) — Eugene will keep Oregon's class A-1 high school basketball tournament at least through 1962.

That decision was reached here Friday by the board of delegates assembly of the Oregon High School Activities association on the fate of the 1962 tournament.

The board decided on Eugene as the site of the 1961 tournament earlier this year.

Portland Memorial Coliseum officials had sought to

gain the 1962 tournament. At Eugene, the hoop meet is played at the University of Oregon's MacArthur Court.

Through last winter, Eugene has been the site of the A-1 basketball meet for 11 straight years.

In other action, Dr. Larry Winters, Portland assistant school superintendent, was elected president of the board.

He will succeed Robert Matson of Knappa. Matson, who

filled out a five-year term on the board, was replaced by Leo Christman of Elkton.

The board also decided Friday that pre-season football camps were not legal and voted to continue to oversee the matter. Delegates also voted to give the board permission to grant a league permission to play more than a nine-game schedule.

The approval stemmed from the Portland Interscholastic League's expansion to 11 teams next season, thus necessitating a 10-game schedule. The group unanimously approved the continuation of eightman football and heard a report on redistricting plans.

Coos Bay — (UPI) — Central High School of Monmouth-Independence scored 20 points in the first period and went on to defeat Myrtle Point 20-13 in the Oregon High School class A-2 football championships here Friday night.

Quarterback Dick Weiss threw three touchdown passes to stake the leaders to a 20-0 first quarter lead. Weiss and halfback Ben Hojara combined for a 63-yard pass and run play on Central's first scrimmage play for a touchdown.

Weiss then threw touchdown passes of 17 and 18 yards to give the Panthers their early lead, which proved too much for the Bobcats to overcome. Halfback Tim Taylor and end John Haggerty were on the receiving ends of the passes.

Stopped on One — Myrtle Point battled back to score 13 points in the second period and drove to the winner's one-yard line early in the fourth period only to be stopped short.

Fullback Paul Daniels put Myrtle Point on the scoreboard in the second period when he scored from one yard out to climax a 49-yard drive. Quarterback Rich Armstrong got Myrtle Point's second touchdown when he ran eight yards into paydirt.

The victory gave Central High school its first A-2 grid championship in the school's history.

## 49ers Rumored To Have New Offense Today

Baltimore, Md. — (UPI) — The Baltimore Colts, world's champions and heading for another Western Division crown, are heavy favorites to whip the in-and-out San Francisco Forty Niners when they clash here today.

Coach Red Hickey of the Forty Niners is reported readying a "surprise" attack for his punchless outfit that has scored only two touchdowns in its last two games although breaking even in the tilts.

San Francisco has a 4-4 record, Baltimore is 6-2.

San Francisco is expected to use the same lineup it has started on the offense all season with the exception that Monte Stickles of Notre Dame will start at end in place of Dee Mackey.

And John Brodie probably will get the call at quarterback in place of veteran Y. A. Tittle, who still is hobbling around with a leg injury suffered three weeks ago against Detroit.

There is some talk that Hickey will try an offensive formation of three flankers — plus a single wing-type back-field formation.

This is supposed to be designed to spread the powerful defense of the Colts. And the ball, instead of being snapped from the center to a close-up quarterback, won't be passed until the quarterback is three or four steps back. This will mean, of course, that none of the flankers can be in motion.
