Inglewood, Calif. — (UPI) — The Air Force plans to develop a "space cop" satellite that will seek out and identify mystery satellites in orbit.

The Ballistic Missile division and Radio Corporation of America announced Friday an Agena B. Satellite would perform the high altitude reconnaissance.

The Agena B, which recently carried a Discoverer capsule into orbit from Vandenberg AFB, Calif., is maneuverable and will be able to leave its orbit to pull alongside other satellites for identification.
