### Navy Official Will Present Award Here

To Present Award

Capt. R. N. Holmes, USN, deputy chief of staff for the Naval Reserve of the 13th Naval District, is slated to present the national third place and the district first place awards to the Naval Reserve Electronics Division 135, Medford, in special ceremonies here Monday.

The presentation will take place at 8 p.m. in the Hedrick Junior High school auditorium.

Capt. Holmes, a Naval academy graduate of 1935, has served on both battleships and destroyers and was awarded the Presidential Unit Citation while serving as commanding officer of the USS Benion in 1947. His ship was kept operational following attacks by two Kamakaze planes.

Local Electronics Division 135, formed ten years ago, has taken first place in the district once before, but this is the first time it has been in competition for national awards.

**Based on Factors**  
Competition for the awards is based on factors including total manpower and the quality of training provided as evident by the advancement of men in pay grades.

Reserve spokesmen emphasize that community support is vitally important to achieve such national standards. It is also necessary for every member of the unit to take two weeks training duty every year.

The local electronics division trains radiomen, electronic technicians, signal men, and radarmen for the Naval fleet. Most men, as members of the unit, have the opportunity to go to the best schools the Navy has for this purpose, the spokesman concluded.

Master of ceremonies for the presentation event will be Robert B. Duncan, state representative and speaker of the house.
