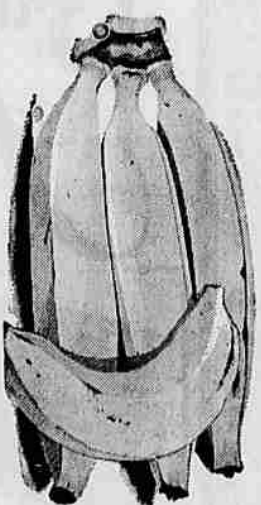

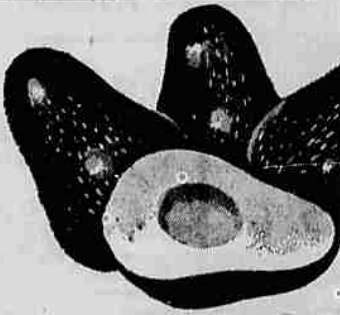

## Kennedy Picks Duty Over Love

Washington—UPI—President-elect John F. Kennedy was faced with that classic choice—love or duty. He chose duty temporarily.

Kennedy showed up at Georgetown University hospital Wednesday two and a half hours late for his usual 5 p.m. visit to his wife and seven-day-old son.

"You're late," a reporter told the hurrying president-elect.

"I know," Kennedy replied. "I'm sorry . . . I had many appointments."

A constant stream of visitors filed in and out of Kennedy's Georgetown home Wednesday as the future chief executive worked on major appointments for his administration.

Some asked Kennedy what he called his son John Jr.—John, Johnny or Jack.

"I don't call him anything yet," the father laughed.

Kennedy was accompanied on the evening visit by his brothers, Robert and Edward, and three assistants, Theodore C. Sorenson, Kenneth O'Donnell and Pierre Salinger.

After the 40-minute call, Kennedy reported his wife and son were "very well indeed."

## Ike Party Head, Goldwater Says

Los Angeles—UPI—Sen. Barry Goldwater, (R-Ariz.), considered a contender for the 1960 Republican party's presidential nomination, said Wednesday the leader of the GOP is President Eisenhower—not Vice President Richard M. Nixon.

Goldwater told a press conference Eisenhower would remain the party's leader until he retires from office Jan. 20.

"After that time we'll have to see what happens," he said.

Nixon must hold some kind of public office before he can hope to exert leadership in the GOP, said Goldwater, generally considered leader of the conservative section of the party.

"It seems to me Nixon would have to be elected a governor, a congressman or some other public official to maintain a forum for his political views," said Goldwater.

Asked if he was seeking the GOP presidential nomination for 1964, Goldwater said he was not—"but I'm not saying that I wouldn't accept it."

Would he support Nixon in 1964—"that's too far off," he said.

## JFK To Retain Post On Harvard Board

Washington—UPI—President-elect John F. Kennedy plans to continue as a member of the 30-man Harvard University Board of Overseers after he moves into the White House, it was reported today.

The Washington Post Times Herald said Kennedy had told his fellow overseers that he would keep his post on the board. His term expires in 1963.
