The purpose of the exhibit was to show the effects of dope. However, Clarence became healthier and the day before the show opened, "Clarence" gave birth to six rats.

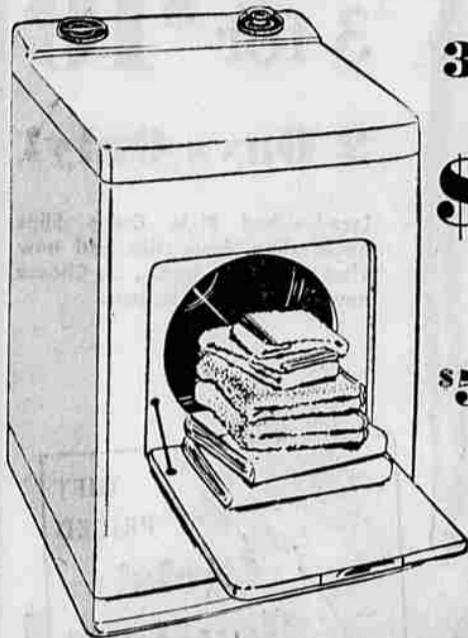
Clarence went on display, but the kids changed his name to Clarice.

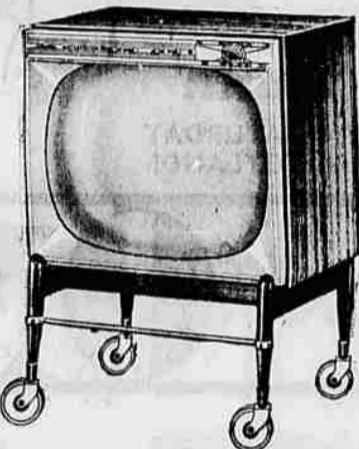

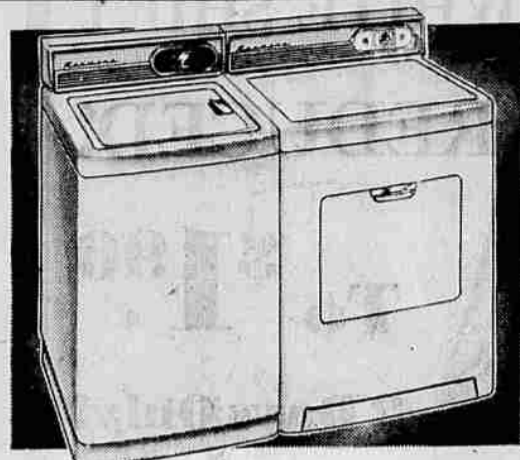

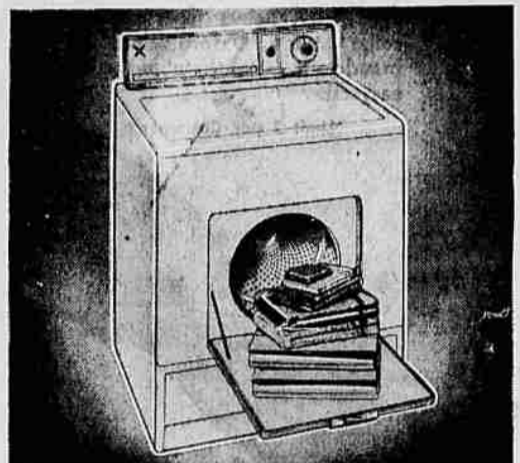
