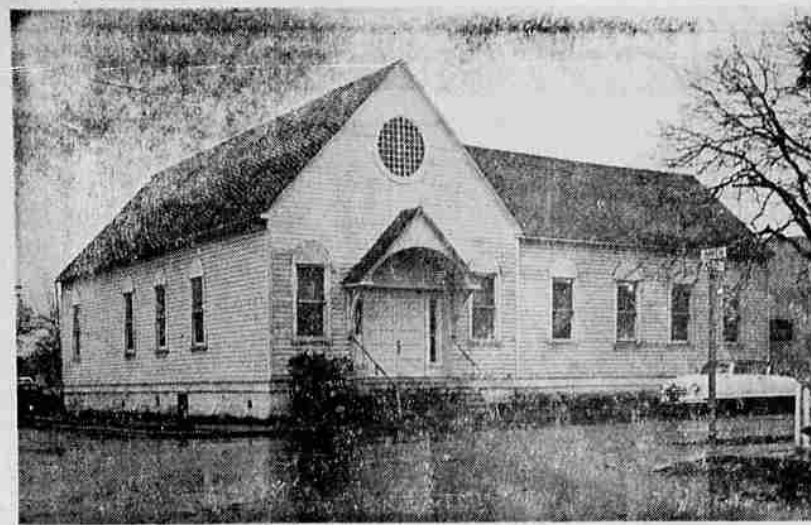

Investment Ends At Valley View

The Sabbath School Investment for 1960 for the Valley View Seventh-day Adventist church closed officially with a program Saturday morning, Dec. 3.
