Police Chief Is Speaker For Red Cross Meeting

Chief of Police Charles P. Champlin spoke on the relationship between the Jackson County American Red Cross and the police department at the Thursday meeting of the Red Cross board of directors.

About 60 members and guests attended the monthly meeting held at the Red Cross chapter house. Dr. Elmo Stevenson, chapter chairman, presided.

Chief Champlin said that in addition to his regular training, each officer is required to have an advanced first aid card. Five Medford police of-

ficers are also qualified first aid instructors who teach groups outside of the police force as well as police officers.

He added that a number of policemen hold "Save a Life" awards issued by the Medford Safety Council and that these were made possible by Red Cross first aid training.

Chief Champlin also praised the Red Cross for its cooperation with the police throughout the past year.

"Red Cross volunteers have made this chapter an active and progressive one of which Jackson county should be very proud," he stated.

Bloodmobile Visit

Participation of the board members was urged in recruiting blood donors for the Bloodmobile scheduled for December 21. Dr. Stevenson stated that Jackson county is using far more blood than is collected each year and so far has collected only 64 per cent of the quota assigned. He further stated that it is a sad reflection on our county that other counties and even servicemen are having to furnish blood that is used by our hospitals to make up the difference.

"Let us urge our friends and neighbors to give the gift of life this Christmas," he added. "Urge them to make an appointment to give their blood."

Mrs. J. W. Burba added that the Bloodmobile will be in Medford on Wednesday, December 21, from 1 to 5 p.m. and that the Jaycees have offered to help sponsor the bloodmobile this visit. All service clubs and churches are being asked to stress the need for blood donors.

Mon Desir is the only local business listed in "Adventures in Good Eating."

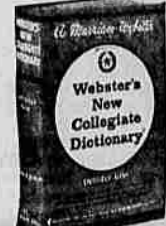
