

Portlanders Tip Fresno

Portland-UPB-University of Portland's Pilots held on after a nine-point halftime lead to score a 56-50 victory over Fresno State in a college basketball game Friday night.

The Pilots, winning their third game in four starts this year, led at halftime, 36-27.

Fresno State closed the gap to two points at one point in the second half to 45-43 with 9:04 remaining. But reserve forward Roland Carpenter bagged a pair of field goals and a free throw and sophomore forward Art Easterly chipped in with a two-pointer to put the Pilots in front at 52-45.

Easterly led the Pilots in scoring with 15 points. Guard Mike Doherty had 13 and center Bill Garner added 11 for the Portlanders.

The Pilots, who had only five fouls called against them as compared with 23 whistled against the California team, won the game at the free throw line with 18 shots to two for the Bulldogs.

Grid Game Turnouts Below Expectations

Corvallis - Oregon State's football attendance for 1960, all games included, was far below expectations of last summer when such forecasts are made.

All told, the Beavers drew 226,652, and it was hoped the figures would be more around 300,000. Biggest throng OSC plays to was the 43,000 at Iowa, and had it not rained all night the Friday before the game and all morning of the game itself, it may have been much higher.

Other game attendance for 1960 included USC at L.A. (32,928), Houston at Portland (22,537), Indiana at Bloomington (25,000), Idaho at Moscow (10,500), Washington at Portland (36,833), California at Corvallis (15,745), Washington State and Pullman (15,600), Stanford at Palo Alto (7,500) and Oregon at Corvallis (27,000).

Biggest disappointments, of course, were the Indiana and Stanford crowds, though both had been consistent losers.

BAN REJECTED

New York-UPB-The Eastern College Athletic conference has overwhelmingly voted against a proposal that would have banned "red shirting" among member schools. Only 27 of the 100 delegates in attendance supported the "red shirting" ban, which would have limited an athlete's eligibility to four consecutive years rather than the current five. The amendment had been offered by the conference's committee of principles and policies and was endorsed by its executive council.

Local Students Halberg To Run In Invitational

Portland - Murray Halberg and Dallas Long, two of the world's greatest track performers, will be in action at the Oregon Indoor Invitational Track meet, scheduled for Jan. 14 at Portland's new Memorial Coliseum, according to meet officials.

Halberg, considered one of the finest distance runners in the world, won the 5,000 meters at the 1960 Rome Olympics and placed seventh in the 10,000 meter test. His appearance in the Oregon meet will probably be the only competitive showing by the New Zealander in this country this winter.

Halberg, who is coming to Portland from Brazil, must return to his native land for that country's national championships within a week after the local meet. A possible opponent for Halberg, who will run in either the mile or two-mile, is Dyrrol Burleson, Olympic Games competitor from Cottage Grove and the University of Oregon.

Long is rated the best collegiate shot put in the nation off his third place finish in the 1960 Olympics. He combined with Bill Nieder and Parry O'Brien, who finished one-two at Rome, to give the United States a sweep of the shot put. A head to head duel between the youthful Long and the Veteran O'Brien, who has been one of the world's best in the shot put for 10 years, is a distinct possibility for the Oregon Indoor Invitational Track Meet.

Package Skiing Trip Offered

A package tour to the Shasta Ski bowl on Dec. 17 is being offered to any junior or senior high school student in Medford who skis or wishes to learn to ski.

The tour includes chartered Greyhound bus transportation, two hours skiing instruction and rope pull use. Local people arranging the trip include Mrs. C. H. Buffington; Jack Crawford, and Arthur Ekerson.

Present plans call for the tour to leave Medford at 6:45 a.m., Dec. 17. Students may rent ski equipment, at additional charge, either in Medford or at Shasta Ski Bowl. Interested students are asked to contact Paul Evensen at Medford Senior high or either principal at McLoughlin and Hedrick Junior High schools before Dec. 14.

Adult chaperones will accompany each bus. Accident insurance coverage for possible skiing mishaps is considered the concern of a student's parents. Students can bring their lunches or buy them at the ski bowl. Competent skiers who would use the ski lift are expected to pay a small additional charge.

Good response to foregoing ski plans would result in a second supervised trip on Wednesday, Dec. 28, on a similar financial basis.

Britain, Soviet Union To Exchange TV Shows

London-UPB-Britain and the Soviet Union will exchange several live television broadcasts next year over the Western European Eurovision and the Eastern European Intervisio networks.

The arrangements, announced Friday, will bring British TV audiences performances of the Bolshoi Ballet. Soviet viewers will see the Soviet Trade Fair in London and other programs.

Pick Own Chief Officials Asked To Let Senate

Portland, Ore. - UPB - Nine Democratic senators - representing both sides of a contest for the Oregon senate presidency - have asked party officials to step aside and let the senate elect its own chief.

The nine made their request in a statement calling for election of a senate president "free from dictation by any party official."

The statement was directed at State Democratic Chairman Robert Straub, who has called on the senate's 20 Democrats to vote in a block for Sen. Alfred Corbett of Portland. Corbett is supported by a majority of Democrats in the senate, but lacks support from the body's ten Republicans.

Sen. Harry Boivin of Klamath Falls has claimed he will win through a coalition vote of Republicans and some Democrats, if the Democrats do not vote together.

The signers of the statement included three Corbett supporters and six Boivin supporters. Among them was Sen. President Walter Pearson, who has strongly backed Boivin.

Other signers were Sens.

Ike's Vacation Quarters Picketed

Augusta, Ga. - UPB - President Eisenhower's vacation headquarters was picketed for the first time Saturday by some 60 Negro college students protesting against segregation.

Eisenhower did not see the pickets and was not informed of their activity.

A sign carried by one teenage girl questioned the President's interest in civil rights matters. It read:

"Lincoln - Emancipation ... Ike - Civil Rights???"

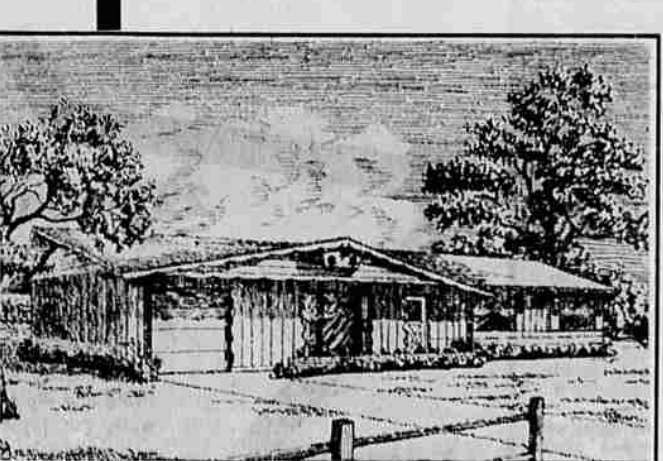
