Chico Gains Sweep Over Raider Cagers

Ashland - Plagued by poor shooting and inadequate rebounding, Southern Oregon college took it on the nose for the second consecutive night in losing 67-45 to Chico State college hoops here Saturday.

Wildcat Harold vonBargen tallied 25 points and controlled 24 rebounds to lead the Chico attack which had won the night before over SOC 75-66.

Dave Hughes hit 19 for the Raiders but he was the only one to get more than eight. Four Wildcats hit the double numbers.

SOC made a game of it for the first 10 minutes on leads of 2-0, 3-2, 5-4, and 7-6. Two free tosses by Wilbur Smith and Denny Varley put Chico ahead 8-7 and it continued on the top remainder of the evening.

Raider shooting fell apart. SOC hit only two field goals in its first 19 attempts. By halftime Chico had a 29-18 bulge.

Earle Tichenor, who got six of his eight points in a five minute span, narrowed the lead to 34-26 early in the second half. Chico again took command and the potential rally by SOC was cut short. A do-or-die full court press by the Raiders in the closing minutes proved unsuccessful as the Wildcats expanded a 12 point lead to 22.

Southern Oregon managed only a .167 shooting percentage from the field in the first half but finished with .239.

SOC's first unit averaged four misses per player and Brad Flannery was whistled to the sidelines five minutes before the conclusion.

Everything appeared to go wrong for the Raiders as Gordy Carrigan had one of the poorest nights of his career in hitting two of 19 field shots.

Chico grabbed off 63 rebounds and SOC 41 while the big edge was in Chico's defensive count which was 39. On the same board, SOC's offensive, the Raiders got 14.

SOC will have 10 days rest for collegiate tests. They return to action against Humboldt State in Arcata, Calif., on Dec. 19 and 20.

Portland salvaged some of the state's major college basketball reputation by beating Pepperdine 46-44 in the final second in the second game of a doubleheader in Portland. Seattle raced past Fresno State 104-73 in the opener.

Oregon, which lost to Wyoming Friday night at Laramie, was never in the game against the fast-breaking Buffs. Forward Wilky Gilmore paced the Colorado scoring attack with 20 points.

Warren's 18 points, trailed at halftime, 31-22.

In Seattle Bill Hanson topped Washington's scoring with 19 and Jay Carly paced the Beavers with 14.
