Scholarship Plan Receives Approval

Salem - (UPI) - An expanded state scholarship plan, calling for 50 scholarships worth \$500 each a year for any college or university in Oregon, has been approved by the State Scholarship committee.

The commission will recommend the program to the 1961 legislature.

It follows a similar proposal by Gov. Mark Hatfield. The commission agreed with Hatfield but favored changing the law to lift restrictions that scholarships would be used only at state-owned schools.

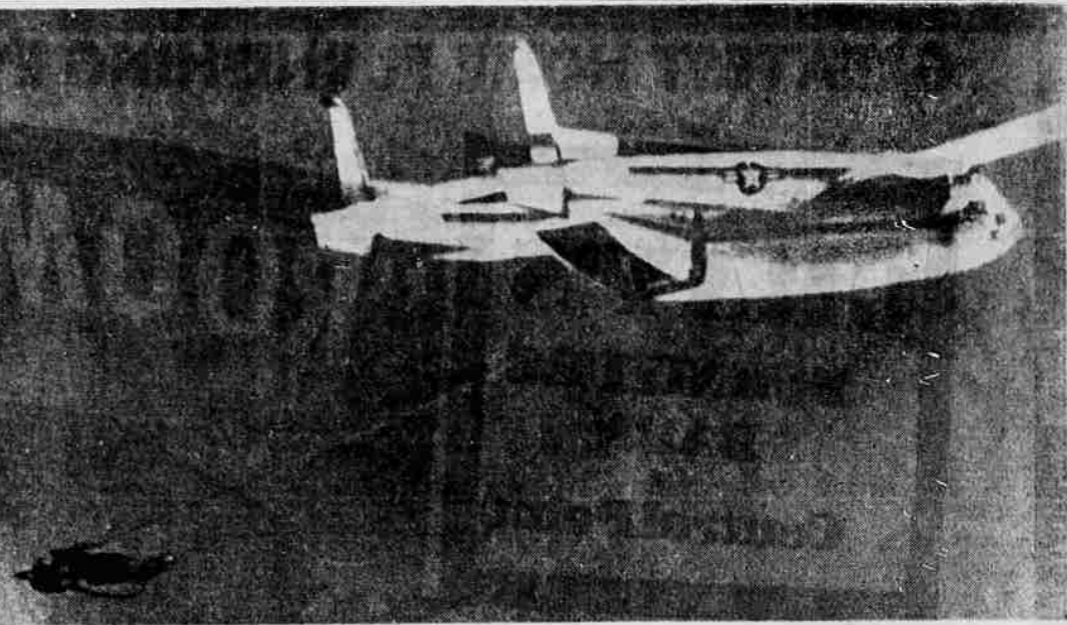
Recuperating - Charles Gibson, Thompson creek, is in Sacred Heart hospital convalescing following surgery.

Sportsmen's Group Urges Ban on Dams

Spokane - (UPI) - The Washington State Sportsmen's Council Sunday adopted a resolution urging federal legislation to prohibit construction of any dams on the Salmon river of Idaho.

The resolution also urged limiting the head of any dam on the Snake river below the mouth of the Salmon to 100 feet.

The group refused to adopt a proposal by the Spokane delegation that the fishing season in Spokane, Stevens and Pend Oreille counties open in January instead of April.

War on Starlings Opens in Portland

Portland - (UPI) - State Department of Agriculture personnel were to begin netting, poisoning, and gunning down starlings today.

The day marks the beginning of another annual drive to control the invasion of flocks of starlings into Oregon - a drive which last year eliminated 1,257,000 of the birds.

In addition to guns, the devices used to kill the birds include lights that lure the starlings into trap nets, where they are gassed. Poisoned potato chips also are used.

The U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service will aid state officials in their anti-starling effort. More than a million of the destructive birds are expected to arrive in the state in the coming month, threatening holly and foliage.
