

Former Dalles Port Manager Files Suit

Portland — (UPI) — Charles Tait, former manager for the Port of The Dalles, has filed suit in U.S. District Court here for \$10,150.01 against the port.

Tait, now a resident of California, served as port manager at the Columbia river city from Oct. 1, 1959, until last month.

In the suit, Tait claims the Port of The Dalles breached the contract under which he was hired during November when he was told he was no longer employed.

Tait said in the action he was hired under a two-year contract calling for a salary of \$10,000 the first year and \$12,000 the second year.

The suit said he was paid \$11,999.99 as salary plus \$1,442.01 expenses at the time he left. He is claiming additional salary of \$10,000.01 and \$150 expenses for moving back to California.

Talks Recessed In Phone Dispute

Seattle — (UPI) — Contract talks between representatives of the Electrical Workers Union and officials of the West Coast Telephone Co. were recessed Wednesday after management offered two alternate proposals.

Federal Mediator Barney Tuner said no date was set for resumption of talks and he declined to reveal what the proposals were, saying it was up to the parties involved to make such matters public if they desire.

The session was described earlier as a "last ditch" meeting to head off a threatened strike of the 1,600 workers involved in Western Washington, Oregon and Northern California.

The union is seeking a 10 per cent wage increase. The company's last revealed offer was three per cent.

Kestbaum, who served the Eisenhower administration in several capacities since 1953, died Wednesday of a heart attack.



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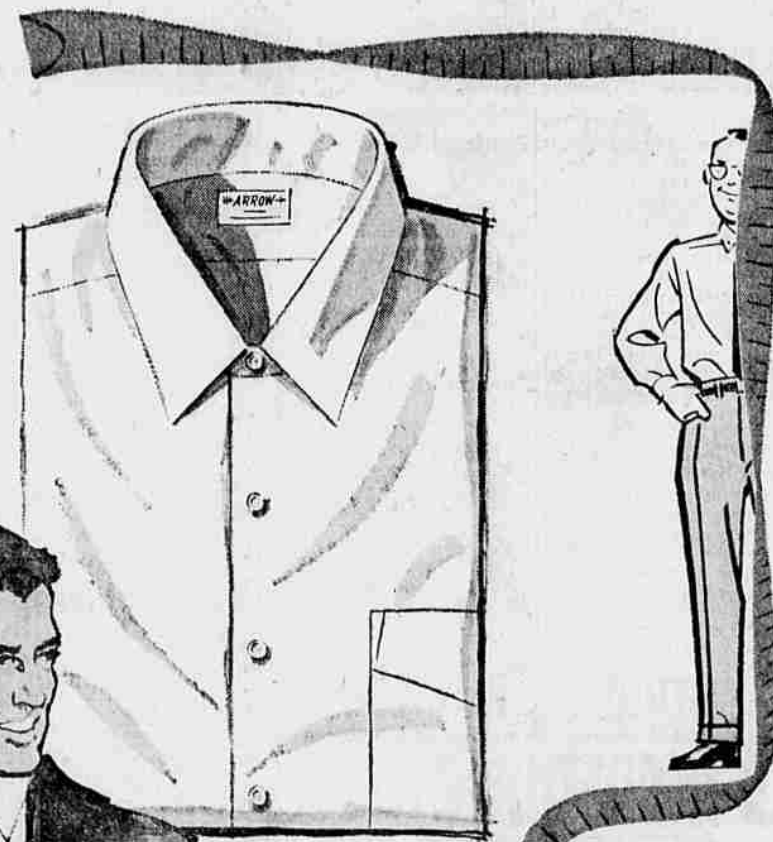
