BLM Reorientation Training Session Conducted in City

"New guidelines in BLM operations" was the theme of a reorientation training session conducted for Medford district employees this week. Area Administrator James A. Doyle of Portland described the bureau's Project Twenty-Two stating that it offered broad guidelines until the year 2012, which marks the 20th anniversary of BLM.

John Bowers, recreation staff officer from the BLM state office, discussed the bureau's current emphasis to provide public recreation facilities in cooperation with the counties of western Oregon.

Bureau's Responsibility
The significance of determining the most advantageous use of public lands was described by Harold T. Tyak of the area administrator's staff. He mentioned the bureau's responsibility for managing all resources on a multiple use, sustained yield basis in the manner most in the public interest.

Eric W. Allen Jr., managing culture of the Medford Mail Tribune and member of the Medford district advisory board, discussed the topic, "In the Public Interest."

Professor Arthur Blakeney of the Oregon system of higher education, who currently is

conducting a series of personnel management courses by BLM employees, analyzed reports submitted by BLM district employees this week.

Coordinated management of all resources on the public domain and reoriented railroad grant lands administered by the bureau was emphasized by Russell E. Getty, BLM state supervisor.

Reviews Progress
Edwin Zanditz, forest management staff officer in the BLM state office in Portland, reviewed progress toward identified forest management. The importance of safety was stressed by John Hunt of the state office.

Medford district employees participated in the program by reviewing the values of specific land management plans and suggesting methods for improving resource management.

District Manager Ross A. Youngblood concluded the training session by describing the necessity of teamwork in BLM operations.

Lighting Contest Set in GH Area

Gold Hill—The Gold Hill Lions club will sponsor an outdoor home Christmas lighting contest for residents of the Gold Hill community.

This is the sixth year the local Lions have sponsored an outdoor lighting contest to promote Christmas spirit through beautifying the area with outdoor lighting and decorations.

Judging will be based on three requirements: originality, Christmas theme, and outside lighting techniques. Judging will be done sometime between Dec. 20 and Dec. 27.

Winners will receive various cash prizes which have been donated by Gold Hill Lions club.
