Nuclear Weapons For NATO Opposed

New York - (AP) - A group of prominent Americans, including Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, entertainer Steve Allen and psychologist Eric Fromm, have protested any move to give NATO forces an independent pool of nuclear weapons.

The group issued their protest Thursday in letters to President Eisenhower and President-elect John F. Kennedy. They warned that turning NATO into a separate nuclear force could set off "a chain reaction" for a similar move in the Communist bloc's Warsaw Pact group.

The statement was issued through the National Committee for a Sane Nuclear Policy.

Jehovah's Witnesses Plan Circuit Assembly Jan. 6

At the Eureka meeting plans were outlined for setting up some 20 convention departments to facilitate a smooth operation.

Climax of the meet will be the public talk by principal speaker, Lester M. Dugan, Sunday, Jan. 8, at 3 p.m. As special representative of the group's world-wide headquarters in Brooklyn, New York, he will speak on the subject, "Is God Interested in the Affairs of Men?"

At the Sunday 4 p.m. public talk the topic will be "Are Jehovah's Witnesses Christian?" The Kingdom hall is located at 2402 Jacksonville highway.
