School programs scheduled Wednesday, Dec. 21, include: Hedrick Junior High's program, which will be in four parts, starting at 7:30 p.m. The first part will feature the orchestra under the direction of John Drysdale; part two will feature the select choruses under the direction of Carroll Brager and Gary Lovre; part three, the orchestra, and part four, the combined seventh, eighth and ninth grade choruses in a program of religious and secular Christmas music.

Griffin Creek Program — Griffin Creek's program, starting at 8 p.m., will have "Christmas in Mother Goose Land" as its theme. Choral music will be provided by a 50-voice chorus of third and fourth graders. The combined fifth and sixth grade choruses will present Christmas selections as the final offering.

and the "Nutcracker Suite" presented by the third and fourth grades. It will include the Nutcracker coming to life, toy soldiers, dancing dolls and fairies, and the "Waltz of the Flowers."

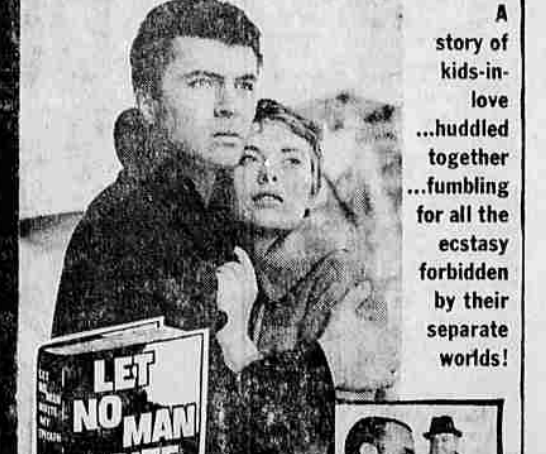
Through Christmas Cards — Jefferson Schools program, with Christmas as viewed
