SOC Gets \$49,200 Grant for Summer Institute for Teachers

Ashland - Southern Oregon college has been granted \$49,200 by the National Science Foundation to conduct a special 1961 summer institute for junior high school teachers of science, President Elmo N. Stevenson has announced.

Dr. Irene Hollenbeck, SOC professor of science, will serve as general project director. Dr. Stevenson said. Dr. Clarence E. Diebel, SOC professor of science, will serve with Dr. Hollenbeck as codirector of the general science courses to be offered.

Fifty junior high school general science teachers will be enrolled. Dr. Stevenson said, and the course may be taken for either graduate or undergraduate credit. Each teacher will receive a \$450 stipend, and those having dependents will be allowed \$90 each, with travel allowances in every instance up to a maximum of \$80.

Certain Stipulations

Applicants will be accepted from all sections of the United States, subject to certain stipulations. They must have a continuing junior high school teaching appointment; display teaching potential; have need of additional work in science; an acceptable outline for independent study, along with approved college science and teaching credentials.

Dr. Hollenbeck, who attended a recent meeting of directors of summer institutes in San Francisco, pointed out that the science teaching at the junior high level constitutes a problem area.

From observations made by the SOC science survey committee and similar committees throughout the nation, it was determined that there was a general lack in subject matter preparation, and much uncertainty and confusion as to content, emphasis, and presentation.

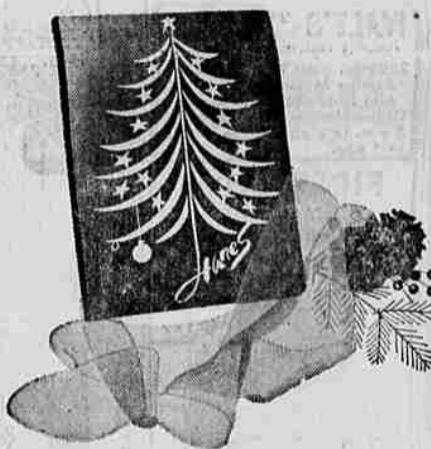
