Nilsen Warns on Reorganization Of Department

Portland—UPI—Labor Commissioner Norman O. Nilsen warned members of the legislature Tuesday against what he called proposals for "drastic reorganization" of the State Labor Department.
In a letter to each legislator, Nilsen said Gov. Mark Hatfield's proposals to appoint instead of elect the labor commissioner and to revamp the labor department were uncalculated.
Furthermore, Nilsen said, they would tend to make the department less responsive to

the people.
The proposals attacked by Nilsen are part of the governor's reorganization plan for Oregon's government. Under the new labor department, in addition to making Nilsen's position appointive, Hatfield would consolidate several now-independent agencies related to labor and employment.
Hatfield has claimed the change would provide efficiency and coordination, and would "establish a true department of labor in Oregon state government."
Nilsen said the governor had failed to demonstrate the need for such changes in the labor field.

'Cool Customers' Land Disabled Plane in Bermuda
Otis AFB, Mass. -UPI- A couple of "cool customers" at the controls of an Air Force Constellation piloted the plane safely to Bermuda early today after one engine burned and plunged into the sea. The plane carried 15 men.
Lt. Joseph T. Long Jr., 27, Houston, Tex., aircraft commander, and copilot Joseph Haber, Newburgh, N. Y., brought the crippled ship to Kindley Field, Bermuda, on a wing and a prayer.
A fire blew out when they hit the runway but they kept the lumbering ship under control.
"They're a couple of cool customers," said Lt. Col. Timothy W. Donohue, base information officer and also a Constellation pilot.
Donohue said Long and Haber had left Otis at 3 a.m. to relieve another Constellation on radar picket duty. As they approached the rendezvous point near Bermuda the inside engine on the right side caught on fire.
