

United States Asked To Help Independence-Hungry Nations of World

Steps Suggested To Check Commie Trouble Making

Washington (UPI) — Two senators, a Republican and a Democrat, have called on the United States to help independence-hungry nations attain self government in order

to stymie Communist trouble-making.

Sen. Alexander Wiley, senior Republican on the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, said the goals of the United States and the rest of the west should be to foster greater political stability in newly emerging countries and to seek means to "best block efforts of Communists to penetrate" those areas.

Self-Government Best

The way to provide former colonies with the "best climate . . . to attain their na-

tional destinies" is to give them self-government, the Wisconsin Republican said.

Democratic Sen. Frank Moss of Utah, just back from a tour of Africa, said the restless nations of that continent felt the Eisenhower administration had turned its back on them and sided with the colonial powers.

Moss predicted President-elect John F. Kennedy would reverse this policy when he takes over the White House next month.

Moss returned last week

from a five-week, 22,500-mile tour of 16 African countries with Sen. Frank Church (D-Idaho), who is expected to succeed Kennedy as chairman of the Senate foreign relations subcommittee on Africa, Sen. Gale McGee (D-Wyo.), and Ted Kennedy, brother of the president-elect.

Money, Guidance Needed

"We have cast ourselves in the light of lining up with the colonial powers, and against the newly emerging free powers, or people that are seeking freedom," Moss said.

He said the U. S. abstention on an anticolonial proposal in the United Nations "was interpreted throughout Africa as the United States turning their backs on the free nations, and staying with the colonial powers."

"What Africa needs are relatively small amounts of money, but large amounts of technical assistance and guidance," Moss said.

EXPORT-IMPORT REPORT

Washington (UPI) — The value of United States exports will top imports by more than \$5 billion during 1960, the Commerce Department predicts. The department's office of business economics said Monday night that exports in July-August-September reached a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$20 billion while the yearly rate for imports was just under \$15 billion.

ACTOR FILES SUIT

Los Angeles (UPI) — Veteran actor Pat Buttram has filed suit for \$136,000 as the result of what he claims a breach of contract involving a TV series. Buttram said in the superior court suit made public today that he was to act in the "Down Home" television series but his contract was broken without proper cause. He named in his complaint Savannah Productions Inc., 20th Century-Fox Television Inc., and writer Hal Kanter.
