Raiders Encounter C of I in Tourney

Ashland - Southern Oregon college basketball squad, minus a starting guard, opens play in the Northwest Nazarene tournament at Nampa, Idaho, tonight against College of Idaho. In the second game tonight, host Northwest Nazarene will face Western Montana.

Tonight's winners clash Friday night for the tourney title while the losers meet in a consolation game.

The Raiders are entering the two-day tourney without the services of Brad Flannery, a sophomore from Bend, who has been sidelined because of scholastic difficulties.

However, coach Ted Schopf has a pair of capable replacements for the empty guard slot. One, Jerry Shultz, a Medford frosh, has performed well in his reserve role but has to contend with Dave Gardner, a junior from Prospect.

Jensen on Squad Junior Bob Jensen filled in Flannery's position on the 10-man traveling squad.

Other starters in tonight's tilt will be Don Vannice and Dave Hughes at forwards, John Payne at center, and vet-

eran Gordy Carrigan at guard. Carrigan is the squad's leading scorer with 116 points in seven games.

Filling out the traveling roster are Larry Eickworth, Earle Tichenor, and Dave Graham.

Following the tourney at Nampa, next action for the Raiders is a week end series with Eastern Oregon college Jan. 6 and 7 at Ashland, which opens Oregon Collegiate Conference play for both teams.

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OSC, Seattle Nab Far West Tussles

Portland - (UPI) - Oregon State and Seattle, two teams who figured to win, and Arizona State of Tempe and Idaho, two teams who didn't, were in the semi-finals of the eight-team Far West Basketball Classic today.

The Beavers, who are seeking another Far West championship, edged Wisconsin's Badgers, 56-54, and Seattle ran away from Washington State 72-61.

Surprising Idaho rang up a 65-51 triumph against Portland and fired-up Arizona State nipped Oregon, 54-53.

OSC Meets Idaho Seattle will collide with Arizona State at 7:30 p.m. and Oregon State will meet Idaho at 9:30 p.m. tonight. In consolation play today, Washington State met Oregon and Wisconsin and Portland played this afternoon.

The tournament, co-hosted by Oregon State and Oregon and being held for the first time at Portland's multi-million dollar Memorial Coliseum, drew 8,865 for the opening round action.

Seattle used a dazzling fast break and a ball-hawking defense to get by Washington

State. The Chieftains led at halftime, 33-25. Eddie Miles paced the Seattle attack with 19 points. Charlie Sells triggered the Cougar offense with 20.

Anderson's Shot Wins Karl Anderson tossed in a field goal with 10 seconds left to give Oregon State its win. The field goal, coming on a rebound of a missed shot by Jim Woodland, broke a 54-54 tie.

Woodland led the Oregon Staters with 16 points and Anderson had 12.

Arizona State, beaten by Oregon 71-55 only a week and a half ago, won the game on Rex Dernovich's free throw with 2:36 remaining. It put Arizona State out in front at 54-52. Charlie Warren of Oregon topped all scorers with 25 points.

Idaho was ahead except for an early 3-2 Portland advantage and the win reversed a 53-50 victory by the Pilots earlier this season.

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Pasadena Victor Over Willamette

Chico, Calif. - (UPI) - Willamette, ahead by three points at halftime, dropped an 86-75 decision to Pasadena in the semi-finals of the Chico Invitational Basketball tournament Wednesday night.

Pacific Lutheran rolled past Cal Poly of Pomona, 102-87, in the other semi-final game of the eight-team tournament.

Willamette, which defeated host Chico State Tuesday night, led at halftime, 42-39. Buzz Wilfert and Junior Sato topped the Beacars with 19 and 17 points, respectively.

Roger Bloomquist had 23 to lead the Pasadena scoring attack.

In consolation action, Chapman bounced Humboldt State, 67-56, and Sacramento State edged Chico, 64-63.

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Ohio State, St. Johns To Collide

By DICK JOYCE United Press International Ohio State, the nation's top-rated team, puts its record on the line against third-ranked St. John's tonight at Madison Square Garden in a "meeting of the unbeaten" that highlights a frenzy of more than 20 college basketball tournaments.

Three two-day tournaments were decided Wednesday night, with Detroit, Butler and Denver winding up as champions.

Principal national attention tonight is centered on the semi-finals of both the Holiday festival in New York and the Big Eight tourney in Kansas City, and the start of the Dixie classic at Raleigh, N.C.

Detroit won the Motor City tournament Wednesday night by defeating Colorado State in the final, 77-64; Butler took the Hoosier classic with a 65-63 triumph over Purdue, and Denver won the Evansville Indiana invitational by beating Penn State, 58-50.

Top Teams Involved Three of the country's five highest-ranked teams are involved in the semifinals of the Holiday festival in New York. Fifth-ranked St. Bonaventure meets Utah in the preliminary to the clash between Ohio State and St. John's, both of which have 7-0 records.

Kansas State and Kansas, ranked 12th and 13th, respectively, meet in the final of the Big Eight tournament tonight. Kansas State gained the title round with a 73-52 romp against Oklahoma, and Kansas made it by beating off Iowa State's late rally to win, 76-72. Xavier (Ohio) swamped Yale, 72-39, in the consolation game of the Motor City meet.

Butler edged Purdue in the Hoosier Classic final when little Gerry Williams threw in a 20-foot jump shot with 9 seconds left to play. Notre Dame beat Illinois, 69-66, in the consolation.

The host Evansville team beat Los Angeles State, 121-115, in the opener in its invitational.

Utah State and Wichita reached the semifinals round of the All-College tournament at Oklahoma City. Utah State defeated Texas Christian, 87-61, and Wichita beat Houston, 71-68. Utah State, the tourney defending champion, plays Wichita in one semifinal tonight while New York University meets Baylor in the other.

Indiana Beats Stanford Big Ten teams divided the four opening-round games

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with their West Coast rivals in the opening round of the Los Angeles classic. Indiana, ranked fourth nationally, was hard-pressed to beat Stanford, 58-50, and Iowa edged California, 83-80, in the fourth overtime period. Southern California drubbed Minnesota, 75-52, and seventh-ranked UCLA walloped Michigan State, 98-61.

Iowa's Dave Nelson and Cal's Bill McClintock lived up to their press notices with 32 and 26 markers respectively. The regular game ended 62-44. Then it was 68-68, 76-76 and 76-76 again after a cautious, deep-freeze third overtime. Iowa's Ron Zabor hit two quick baskets in the fourth overtime to sew up the thriller.

Host Miami beat Army, 82-75, and Holy Cross squeezed past Tennessee, 68-67, in the Hurricane classic at Miami Beach, and Georgia topped Florida State, 62-56, and Florida State downed Jacksonville university, 82-68, in the Gator Bowl tourney at Jacksonville.

The opening round of the Dixie classic tonight pits Maryland vs. North Carolina, Villanova vs. N.C. State, Marquette vs. Wake Forest, and Wyoming vs. Duke.

In the Sugar Bowl Tourney at New Orleans, it will be West Virginia vs. Tulane and Western Kentucky vs. Memphis State.

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
