

Mail Tribune Man Appointed Juror For Pulitzer Award in Journalism

New York—UPI—Thirty news executives, including Eric W. Allen Jr., managing editor of the Medford, Ore., Mail Tribune, have been appointed Pulitzer Prize journalism jurors for 1961. Columbia University President Grayson Kirk announced Sunday.

The jurors will assemble at Columbia March 9-10 for the judging process and their recommendations in eight journalism categories will be forwarded for final selection and approval to the advisory board on the Pulitzer prizes and the university's board of trustees.

To Consider Entries

The jurors will consider entries for the Pulitzer prizes in the categories of public service, local reporting under edition pressure, local reporting not under edition pres-

sure, national reporting, international reporting, editorial writing, cartoonists' work and news photography.

The jurors submit two to five recommendations in each category, without necessarily indicating order of preference, to the advisory board, which may select, accept or reject them.

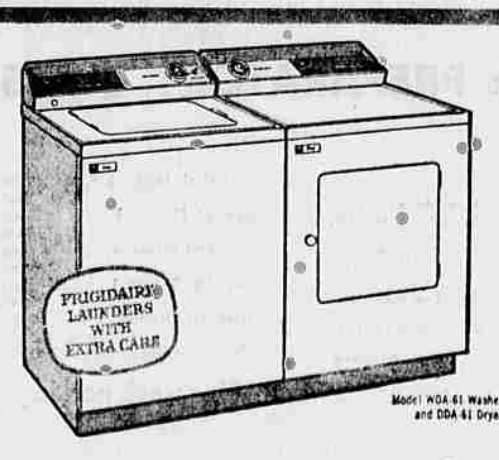
