Cal Tech Students Play Havoc With Washington's Rose Bowl Card Stunts

Pasadena—(UPI)—A dozen pranksters from the California Institute of Technology played havoc with three of Washington's Rose Bowl card stunts in a conspiracy executed as well and secretly as any cloak and dagger operation.

Television viewers and bowl fans alike were somewhat mystified during the halftime when a card stunt that was billed as spelling out "Husky" came out "Caltech."

Shortly afterward, instead of spelling out "Huskies," the word came out spelled backwards.

To add insult to injury, the Washington rooting section ended its presentation, not with a dog head for the Huskies but with a Beaver's head for Caltech.

One of the plotters—who insisted on remaining anonymous at least until Washington fans left Southern California—said the idea was hatched before Christmas.

Carefully printed rooters' cards were prepared and last Saturday night when the Huskies were at Disneyland the forged cards were substituted.

In all, 2,232 of the false cards were used to make the gag come off.

"It took 170 man hours of work," said one of the conspirators. "We just did it to see if it could be done."

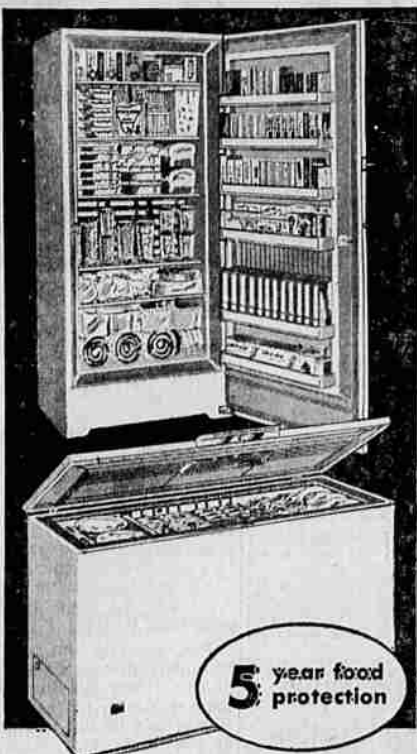

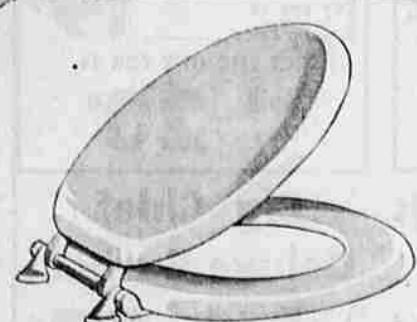
