

# NCAA Rules Committee Considers Cases of Tarheels and Arizona

Pittsburgh — (UPI) — The NCAA today placed the University of North Carolina and Loyola university of New Orleans on probation for one year and barred their basketball teams from competing in the National Collegiate Basketball championships and any other invitational basketball events.

The NCAA also placed the University of Arizona on probation for one year but did not impose any sanctions.

Pittsburgh — (UPI) — The 18-member ruling committee of the National Collegiate Athletic Association passes judgment today on the universities of North Carolina and Arizona which allegedly violated recruiting regulations.

It was the second time the Tar Heels had stated their facts. A four-man delegation headed by Chancellor William B. Aycock met with the committee behind closed doors for two hours and 20 minutes Sunday.

Los Angeles — (UPI) — Leo Durocher, who first joined the Dodgers 23 years ago, was back with the same club today as a coach — a job he asked for after charging major league owners had blacklisted him.

Donning the same number two he wore as both player and manager, Durocher joined with Los Angeles Dodgers Manager Walter Alston in an official announcement at a press conference Monday that he was back with the club. It marked his return to baseball six years after leaving the then New York Giants as manager.
