

State Dairymen Meeting Attended By Medford Men

A number of Jackson county men are attending the annual meeting of the Oregon Dairymen's association in Salem which started Tuesday and continues through Thursday.

They include Don Geren, Eagle Point, Richard Westberg, Ashland, manager of Coordinated Milk Sales, Lester Adams, manager of Oregon Milk Producers, and Victor Birdseye, Medford, Oregon Dairymen's association director.

William J. Hintz, Iowa dairy farmer and vice president of the American Dairy Council, will be one of the featured speakers Wednesday. He will speak on "We Sell Dairy Products at Home and Abroad."

The session starts with registration at 8 o'clock. Committee meetings follow at the Marion hotel. These include health and DHIA, dairy promotion, nominating and auditing.

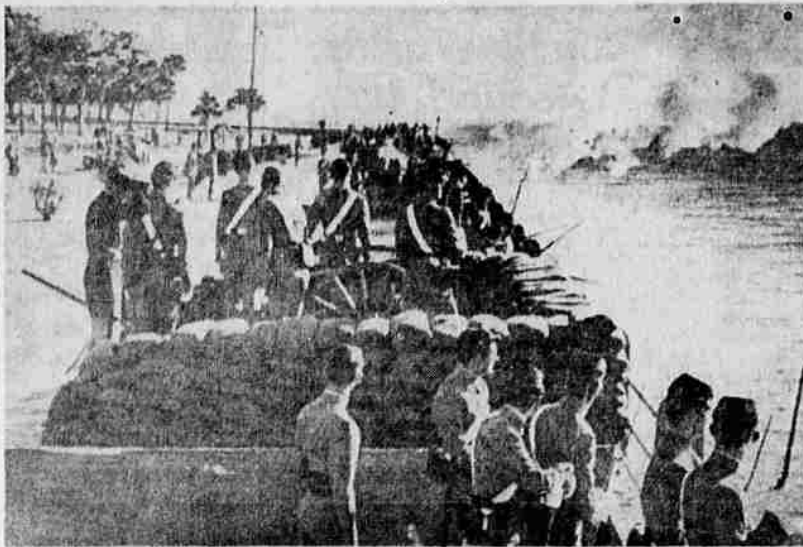
Registration Wednesday starts at 8:30 a.m. followed by president's remarks and announcements. Talks will be given on dairy promotion during the morning session. During the dairy council luncheon, Miss Judy Gibson, Oregon's Dairy Princess, will be presented.

Governor To Speak
Talks Wednesday afternoon include a talk by Gov. Mark Hatfield on state government progress; Hitz's talk; Reg. Joe Rogers on milk marketing laws; the new milk audit law by D. P. Shoup, state department of agriculture; and department of agriculture laws by Dick Lyon, also of the state department of agriculture.

F. E. Price, dean and director, agriculture and extension service, Oregon State college, will speak on "Problems of Agricultural Adjustment" during the morning session Thursday. Dr. D. A. Clarke Jr., University of California, Berkeley, will speak on "The Price of Milk." William J. Hintz will speak on "Paddle Your Own Canoe."

Other talks Thursday will be on milk control problems by Dr. Clarke, DHIA program changes, by W. A. Kessi, president of Oregon DHIA. The annual banquet will be held in the Marion hotel ballroom at 7 p.m. with Vern Hawn, world traveler broker and Guernsey breeder, acting as master of ceremonies.

A group of cadets at The Citadel lined the shore of Charleston Harbor in South Carolina, and, with the pull of a lanyard, changed the course of history.

Two Arrested After Car Hits Trucks

Medford city police arrested two persons Tuesday morning on charges of being drunk in public, after a vehicle apparently crashed into three parked trucks at the McCormick Farm Equipment store, 2232 Biddle rd.

A police officer on routine patrol came upon Lawrence Wayne Frady, 54, and Grace Pearl Goodman, both of Sheed, sitting in the car a short distance away from where it had struck the parked trucks.

Frady told police he had been driving the car and pulled to the side of the road to park and felt a slight bump, but he thought "it to be a minor thing." Police were not sure of the time of the accident, but said it was about 4:45 a.m.

Damage to all three trucks was minor, police said, and the Frady car sustained moderate damage.

The firing on the merchant ship took place Jan. 9, 1861. Monday cadets at The Citadel again lined the shore and cut loose a barrage of rounds at a ship moving up the harbor. The action is part of a centennial pageant, which will re-create the events with near-authenticity.

Commanding the cadets 100 years ago was Maj. P. F. Stevens, head of the military institution. History credits Cadet G. E. Haysworth with the dubious honor of pulling the lanyard on the first shot.

Military Hero
A famous military hero headed the cadets. Gen. Mark W. Clark, of World War II and Korean War fame, portrayed Maj. Stevens, and Cadet Richard Law was to fire the first round Monday. Clark is the president of The Citadel.

The salvo fired Monday was in the direction of the minicraft support ship USS Orleans Parish, rigged out in the disguise of sails, rigging and an authentic looking paddlewheel.

The entire corps of cadets numbering more than 2,000—marching the two miles from the campus to the battery, and an elite group of 100 cadets manned the Confederate artillery pieces.

The centennial week end at Charleston began Saturday with a full dress parade by the cadets, a speech by Civil War historian Bruce Catton and a military ball complete with hoop skirts for the ladies.

One of Many
The pageant is one of the many re-enactments throughout the South during the next four years commemorating the Civil War.

Sunday, Virginia began its observance of the centennial with a quiet ceremony at the tomb of the greatest Southern general—Robert E. Lee. The ceremony coincided with one at the tomb of the Northern general—Ulysses S. Grant—in New York. Dr. Francis P. Gaines, chancellor of Washington and Lee University, praised Lee's work during reconstruction days after the war.

Officials and students of Washington and Lee, which Lee later headed, and from nearby Virginia Military Institute attended the affair.
