

Board of Health Asks High Court To Reject Appeal

Salem—UPB—The state board of health Wednesday asked the Oregon Supreme court to reject an appeal by a Portland scientist to gain access to board data on the amount of radioactivity in water and air in Portland.

Dr. Alan M. Macewan was refused access to board records and he filed suit claiming the board had no right to do so.

On Aug. 18, 1959, Multnomah County Circuit Judge J. J. Murchison upheld the board and Dr. Macewan appealed to the high court. This is the appeal that was argued Wednesday.

Reuben G. Lenseke of Portland, attorney for Dr. Macewan, said the board had put itself into the role of "Czar," and that the doctor's fundamental right as a citizen to see the records are being denied. Macewan, who is studying genetics, wants to inspect the records for several reasons—one to make a determination of hazards from the radiation.

Now Being Exposed

He pointed out that he, his family and the general public are now being exposed to it.

The board's attorney, Floyd Fredrickson of Portland, said the board's main point is that the data Macewan seeks is not part of the public record. Judge Murchison ruled that technical data, field notes, estimates and other details which Macewan seeks do not fall into the classification of public record—which any citizen has access to.

Fredrickson said if Macewan were right, this would open up access to every letter, every note and every "scrap" of public data to anyone in any state, county, city or school office. The result, he said, would be "chaos."

Fredrickson said present law provides "reasonable" limitations on which records may be inspected by the public.

Lenseke also cited the fact that the board allows news media to use some of the data, and puts out periodic news releases. He asked why, if the board does this, it denies a citizen access to the records.
