Package of Election Law Revisions Reviewed

Salem (UPI) — A 42-bill package of election law revisions and a special election bill for school district one in Multnomah county were described Wednesday at the opening meeting of the house committee on elections and reapportionment.

Gable's Widow Gets \$5,000 Per Month

Los Angeles (UPI) — Clark Gable's widow, expecting the late actor's first child in early spring, was granted a monthly allowance of \$5,000 Wednesday pending settlement of Gable's estimated multimillion dollar estate.

Superior Judge Clarke Stephens set the living allowance and said it would remain in effect for no longer than six months, by which time the estate is expected to be settled.

Gable, who died Nov. 16 at the age of 59, left the bulk of the estate to his widow Kay.

100 Korean Orphans Arrive in Portland

Portland (UPI) — A group of 100 Korean orphans, sent to this country through Creswell farmer Harry Holt's orphanage in Korea, arrived here yesterday aboard a Korean National Airlines plane.

Holt started the babylift some time ago and more than 2,000 orphans have been brought to this country.

tee on elections and reapportionment. Elections Director Jack Thompson said he considered the election law revision measures — prepared by his office after consultation with county election clerks — to be primarily "housekeeping" suggestions.

He said he considered the proposals uncontroversial. Some are expected to be introduced in the house and others in the senate.

Rep. Edward J. Whelan, D-Portland, said a bill that would save Multnomah county an estimated \$100,000 in a special school district election March 8 would be introduced in the house Thursday. The bill would allow the district to pool precincts to cut down on polling places.

A hearing on the measure was set for 1 p.m. Jan. 16. Whelan said election and counting board personnel who would lose jobs for the special election were expected to oppose the measure.

Committee chairman George Annala, D-Hood River, said the committee would have to start from scratch on its other big task—reapportionment. He said he expected the committee would draft its own bill after consultations with election officials and interested parties.

Other bills on the touchy subject of revising the legislature's membership, however, could be introduced by individual legislators.

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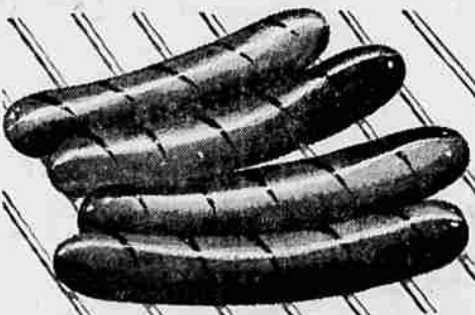
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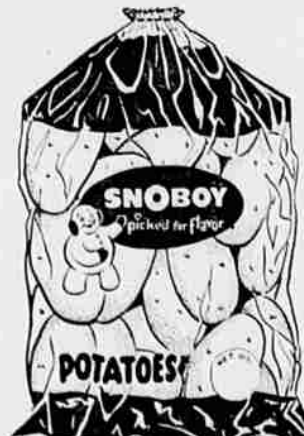


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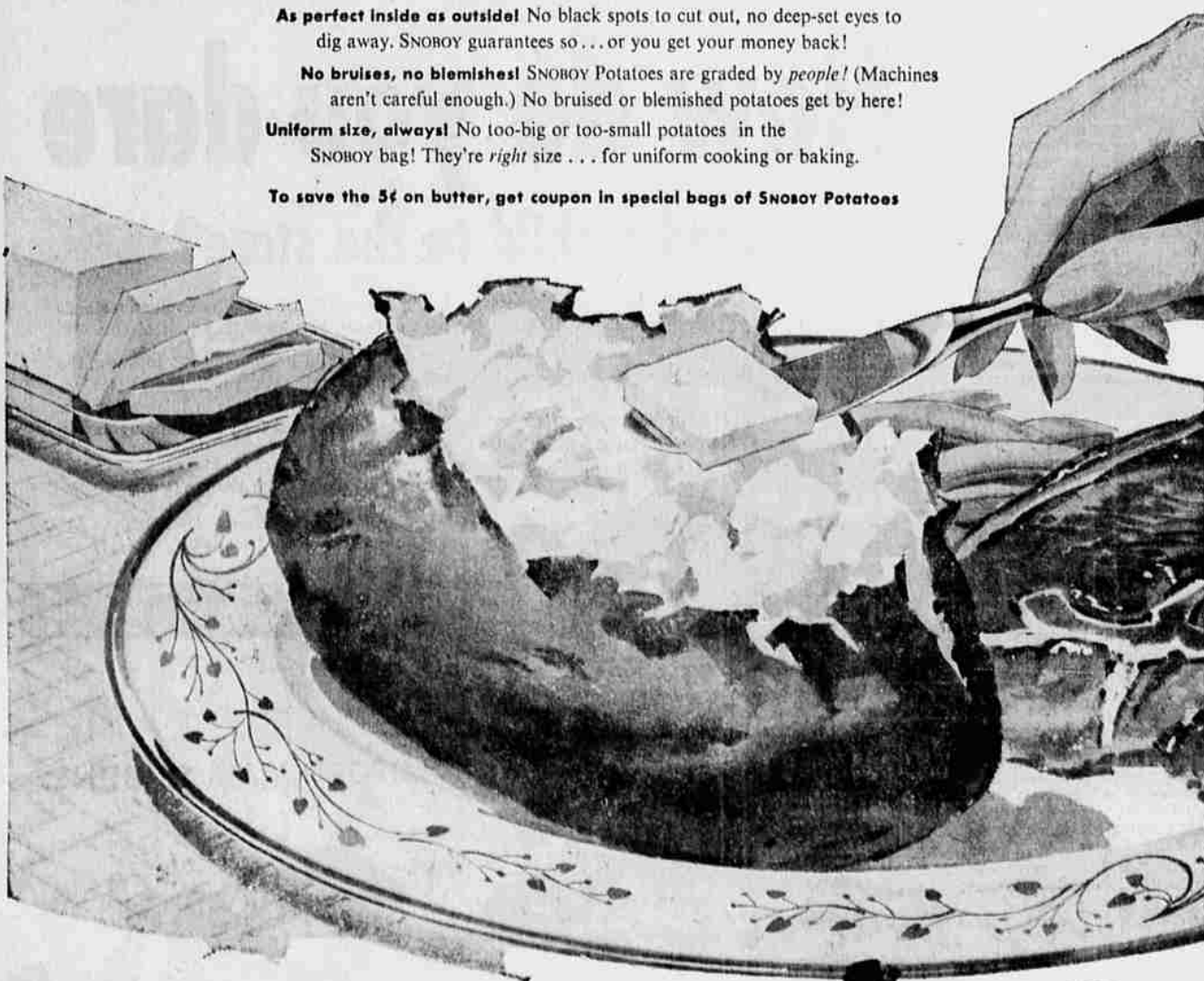
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
