Snag Removal Starts Near Savage Rapids

Snag removal in the Savage Rapids dam area has started, the county court said yesterday afternoon.

The Rogue River chamber of commerce had asked the court to see about snag and stump removal in the area used for boating and water-skiing. Howard Norwood appeared on behalf of the chamber of commerce earlier and at its request the county court received an official letter from the chamber on the problem.

County heavy equipment may be used to remove some of the stumps and snags in the river bottom downstream from the bridge, the commissioners said. County Engineer Robert J. Carstensen will be asked to examine the area.

Welfare work crews are now working at removing dangerous snags sticking out from the shore.
