Hiccups
Every so often I get a letter from someone who has been hiccuping day and night for a week and is getting worn out. We doctors suspect that such hiccuping is due to a virus which has attacked the nucleus of one of the phrenic nerves which runs down from the side of the neck to control one-half of the diaphragm or midriff.

Because I no longer see acute cases, it is years since I have seen a person with a 10-day hiccup but I used generally to stop the torture, and give relief to these people simply by giving a good-sized dose of a strong sleeping medicine, such as nembutal. Usually, the patient slept 10 hours, and when he woke, his hiccup was gone. When children get to hiccuping, perhaps after laughing too much, the simplest way of stopping the spasms of the midriff muscle is to have the child sip some water.

Once when I was a boy and I could not stop my hiccups, our old Scottish nurse started telling me that she had caught me in some devilment, and was going to tell my mother when she came home. I kept puzzling, trying to figure out what particular bit of mischief she had gotten onto. Then she laughed and said, "Y'r hiccups are gone; I scared them out of ye," and she had.

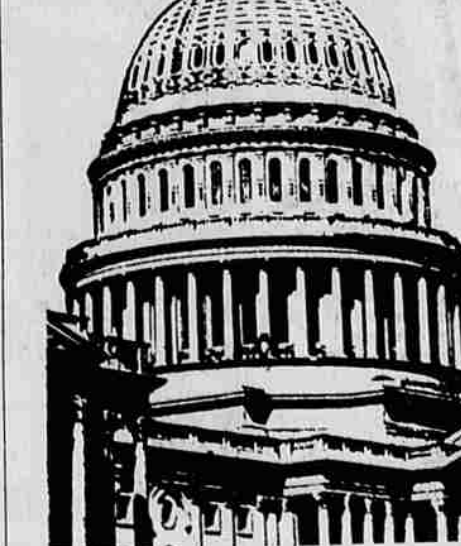
Diabetes on Both Sides Of the Family
A lot of people have been writing to say something like this: "My daughter, since the age of 15, has had severe diabetes. Now she wants to marry. What chance has she of having normal children?" She has a chance of having normal children, but if she is to avoid a still-born child, then—especially during the latter months of each pregnancy—she must be watched at frequent intervals by a man who is highly skilled in the field of diabetes.

The next question the mother asks me is a serious one. She says she is much worried because her daughter is planning to marry a man who has diabetes among his close relatives, and she wonders if this will greatly increase the chances of some of the couple's children being diabetic. She is right. A good thing to do would be to have the young man's blood tested in several ways to see if he is a carrier of a tendency to diabetes.

If he is, and he and his wife should have four children, perhaps three could be either diabetics or carriers of diabetes. If every test suggests that the man is free from a tendency to diabetes, then perhaps only half of the children will have a tendency to get the mother's disease.

Nowadays, the Government and big foundations are giving huge sums for research to cut down the mounting incidence of mental diseases, diabetes, epilepsy, and other troubles that run through families. What distresses and sometimes angers me is that later when the reports come in, there is not a word about heredity or about any need for telling young people, contemplating marriage, that if they both are carriers of a hereditary disease, they are likely to have nothing but great sorrow out of their children.

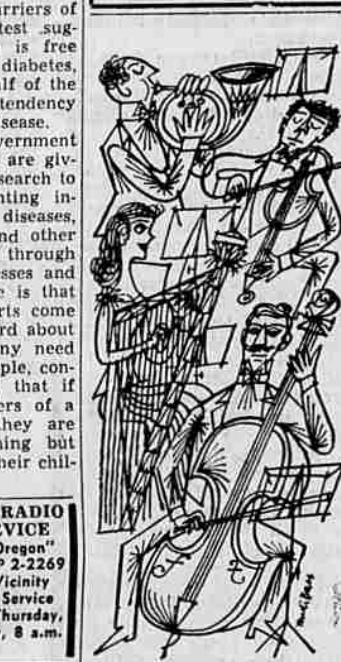
