

Diamond Lake Bait Fishing To Continue; Upper Rogue Season To Open on April 22

Portland — (UPI) — An early trout opening date in the upper portions of the Rogue and Umpqua rivers has been included in the 1961 Oregon sport fishing regulations.

The regulations were approved by the State Game Commission here Friday and announced Saturday.

The opening date for the upper reaches of the Rogue and the North Umpqua for trout fishing was set as April 22.

Anglers were given the old deadline at Oregon City and Diamond Lake after a deluge of protest over two tentative sport fishing rules to ban bait fishing at Diamond Lake and lower the Oregon City deadline.

Trout season openings were set for April 22 on coastal lakes and most inland waters and May 27 on the high Cascade lakes, coastal streams and the rest of the Rogue and Umpqua systems.

Same For Umpqua

In providing some early trout fishing in the Rogue and Umpqua basins, the commission designated Laurelhurst bridge as the lower deadline on the Rogue and Cobblehill bridge on Big Butte creek, both to open April 22. North Umpqua will be opened on the same date above Soda Springs.

The commission, in restoring the Oregon City deadline, emphasized it would lower the line if lower water or any other factor hampered or endangered the run.

The proposal to halt bait fishing at Diamond Lake was thrown out.

Portland Gets Softball Meet

The tournament, which will be made up of 30 teams from throughout the nation, has been scheduled from Aug. 25 through Sept. 2 at Normandale Park. It will be sponsored by Economy Oil.

High Jump Mark Set By Thomas

Boston — (UPI) — The amazing John Thomas broke his own world indoor high jump record Saturday night with a 7 foot 3-1/4 inch leap and Olympian Ernie Cunniffe of Stanford set a world indoor mark in the 1,000-yard run at the 72nd Boston A.A. track meet.

Thomas, 19-year-old Boston university sophomore, cleared the height—bettering the 7-foot barrier for the 56th time in his brief career—on his third try. He had knocked the bar off with his trailing leg on his first two tries at the 7 foot 3 inch mark after clearing 7- and 7-2.

Record Dimmed
The record was dimmed somewhat because of an astounding high jump by an 18-year-old Russian youth in a meet at Leningrad only a few hours earlier. As reported by Tass, the Soviet News Agency, Valeri Brumel jumped 7 feet 4-1/2 inches. Thomas' old indoor mark was 7 feet 2-1/2 inches and his world outdoor mark was 7 feet 3-1/4 inches.

Officials said Thomas' record would be submitted to the A.A.U. as an even 7 feet 3 inches since regulations require that records be submitted in increments one-quarter inch. The 7-3-1/4 height was realized on measurement after Thomas cleared the bar.

Cunniffe, 23-year-old graduate student, turned in a clocking of 2:07.9 minutes

Gary Player Wins Lucky

San Francisco — (UPI) — The \$50,000 Lucky International golf tournament turned out to be both lucky and international for South Africa's greatest golfer of this era — Gary Player.

While the touring "follow the sun" professionals left rain-swept San Francisco today for the heat and sun of Palm Springs in the south, Player was busy banking \$9,000 he collected for a fast winning finish Sunday on sodden Harding Park course.

The Palm Springs Classic, another \$50,000 event that offers a \$50,000 bonus for a hole-in-one, opens on Wednesday and is an 8-hole affair, spread over five golf courses.

Player improved every day during the tournament. He posted rounds of 70-69-68-65 for a 272 — 12 strokes under par for 72 holes. Bayer, the slugger from South Pasadena, Calif., and Don Whitt of Borego Springs, Calif., finished in a deadlock for second at 274, each collecting \$3,800.

Tied for fourth were Don January, Dallas, Tex., and Al Geiberger, Santa Barbara, Calif., each with 275 and picking up \$2,450.
