No Brief Cure for Alcoholism

I get many letters from the wives of alcoholics who hope that there is some quick way in which a doctor can cure a drinker, perhaps in a few weeks, and without his cooperation. Actually, I know of no quick way of curing a strong habituation to any drug. As many an alcoholic has said to me, there is no trick about getting "dried out" in a hospital. In perhaps 10 days or two weeks the man can be sober and acting again. But the day he gets out of the hospital, he is likely to start drinking.

When I visited the able men who run the big hospital in Lexington, Kentucky, where they get thousands of people off of morphine and heroin, the doctors told me that it is of little use just to get a man "off the stuff." They felt that the man should remain with them for at least six months until he is rehabilitated, and prepared to go out into the world, where he must be able to face the trials and tribulations of living and working and occasionally losing a job or a big sale. All men whom I have met who had once become habituated to some drug have admitted that they were not well-adjusted; there was some — usually familial — weakness in their nervous make-up that made it very hard for them to work steadily as a stable man does.

Some of the alcoholics told me of their abnormal shyness, or feelings of inferiority, or hatred of working steadily at the same job each day, or working without an occasional spree. Some said that life without drinking would be an awful bore; others spoke of terrible tensions that build up
