One of the manor's first residents is Mrs. Alice Applegate Peil, native Oregonian and descendant of one of Oregon's oldest and most distinguished families. Mrs. Peil, whose father was Ivan Applegate, taught school for many years and has been on the faculty of both Oregon College of Education, Monmouth, and Southern Oregon college, Ashland. Mrs. Peil took with her to her new home four large, heirloom trunks, one of which is entirely filled with valuable and cherished family papers and historical records.



A wall of huge windows in the dining room will allow residents of Rogue Valley manor to look out on a sweeping view of the valley and western hills by day, and on the city's myriad lights at night. Elegant chandeliers and globe-shaped light fixtures are of dull gold; carpeting and upholstery are in shades of brown, gold, green and red. Only a few of the residents have as yet moved in; each day brings additional members.

Manor residents who enjoy reading will find pleasure in the small library already lined with favorite volumes and with shelves holding current magazines. The retirement home also can boast of a large kitchen with fine equipment, and an infirmary capable of caring for 40 patients. Each floor has a small lounge and the building also includes a sewing room, flower arranging room, a hobby shop with equipment, a smoking room planned as a man's retreat and a game room.



The main entrance of Rogue Valley manor, facing the eastern hills, opens into a spacious lounge with heavy carpet, interesting groupings of furniture and large, decorative lamps. Works of art are on the walls and the ceiling light fixtures include graceful hanging globes. Also on the main floor are a sizeable auditorium, with stage, for showing motion pictures and plays, a small chapel of simple design for religious services or private devotions and offices for the management personnel.
