Pink in High Fashion For Valentine's Day

Love that pink! Pink may be high fashion today but it has been a mid-February favorite ever since St. Valentine was invented. The romantic saint seems to have had a passion for red and white and all variants thereof. So we've been busy in the kitchen stirring up frivolous fancies in the pink of perfection for pleasing your own true love(s).

"Be My Angel" Cake

Pink makes the ideal background for silhouette hearts cut out of semi-sweet chocolate for striking color and flavor contrast. It's simple when you bake an angel cake using a quick mix or buy it at the baker's. The secret of the chocolate hearts is to use the same little morsels of chocolate that make America's favorite Toll House Cookies.

Frost an angel cake with pink-tinted Seven Minute Frosting*. Place five large chocolate hearts** on top of cake and 14 small chocolate hearts around sides.

*Seven Minute Frosting. We repeat this, though it is likely you've made it a hundred times. Combine two egg whites, unbeaten, with 1½ cups sugar, dash of salt, one-half cup water and two teaspoons light corn syrup in top of double boiler. Beat about one minute or until thoroughly mixed. Place over boiling water and beat constantly with sturdy egg beater or at high speed of electric beater seven minutes or until frosting stands in stiff peaks. Stir frosting from bottom and sides of pan occasionally with rubber scraper, spatula or spoon. Remove from boiling water. For a very smooth and shiny frosting, pour at once into a large bowl for final beating. Then add one teaspoon vanilla and beat 1 minute or until thick enough to spread.

**Chocolate Hearts. Combine one six-ounce package (one cup) semi-sweet chocolate morsels and two tablespoons vegetable shortening in top of double boiler; melt over hot (not boiling) water. Spread evenly with back of spoon on aluminum foil-lined 15x10x2 inch pan. Chill until firm, approximately 20 minutes. Invert carefully on waxed paper-lined cookie sheet. Gently peel off foil. Using heart-shaped cookie cutter, two inches across at widest point, cut 22 hearts. Using heart-shaped cookie cutter 2½ inches across at widest point, cut five hearts. Rechill until firm enough to handle, approximately five minutes. If you haven't heart shaped cutters, now is a good time to get them.

Asbestos - Asphalt Pavements Hold Promise of Better Roads

New York—UPI—The American motorist in the near future should be reaping the benefits of a new type of road.

Present-day highway research aimed at improving paving materials.

Motorists presently are paying a price for maintenance of public roads—first for taxes to repair the roads and second for the delays and inconvenience while the roads are out of service.

But in more than 50 specific locations across the nation highway and paving specialists have put down and are now testing a new type of pavement that promises to extend pavement life and reduce

deterioration resulting from traffic and weather. The new pavement consists of conventional asphalt paving mixtures, with the addition of from 2 to 3 per cent of asbestos fibers. According to extensive testing programs conducted by the Johns-Manville Research Center, adding such small quantities of asbestos fiber may double serviceable road life.

Thinner Roads

J-M noted that it also is possible that the paving thick-

ness can be considerably reduced and still give an improved service compared with thicker pavement of conventional asphalt mix, thereby effecting no increase in overall cost.

Some proof of the wearing

qualities of asbestos-asphalt mixes is given by put down during the 1920s. Many of these roads still are in satisfactory service, J-M said, despite the fact that road engineers of that time were not concerned with today's heavyweight trucks and automobiles.

Heavy Duty Uses

Asbestos-asphalt also is being tested for use in problem pavements such as jet air-

strips, heavily traveled access roads to super highways, and

at bus stops where extremely heavy wheel loads and the effects of diesel exhausts tend to ruin asphalt paving in short order.

As a result of this program, J-M said the use of asbestos-asphalt has been specified in New York City for resurfacing pavements over high-pressure steam lines.

Johns-Manville's part in this program is more than just research. It also offers the services of its asbestos research and engineering staffs to local, state and municipal road officials and highway engineers without charge.

A number of paving companies already have started to use asbestos-asphalt pavements, according to J-M, a big asbestos producer itself. Recent commercial applications include several streets in New York City, six acres of recreational fields at the Air Force academy in Colorado Springs,

Colo., heavy equipment yards in Charleston, W. Va., and a roof parking deck in Brookline, Mass., among others.

Interest Spreading

And interest in the potentialities of asbestos-asphalt pavement is spreading. Requests for technical information have been received by J-M from eight foreign countries, including Indonesia, Japan, Peru, and the East Africa area.

It was pointed out that the Soviet Union has used short asbestos fiber in cold asphalt pavement for 10 years with excellent performance reported to date.
