Medford's Black Tornado, Cavemen and Tornado success in the second game was to a good extent due to getting the jump on the Climate Pass's Cavemen, needing victory to bolster its chances of at least a state tournament berth, will be basketball foes tonight at Grants Pass.

Applegate Takes OCC State Lead

Portland — Eastern Oregon's Larry Applegate, on the strength of a 59-point week end series against Southern Oregon at La Grande, took over the scoring lead of the Oregon Collegiate Conference from Oregon Tech's Sammy Smith.

Applegate amassed 211 points in 10 conference games for a 21.0-point average. The Mountaineer hotshot also rated as the second top collegiate point producer in the Northwest this season with a total of 455 points.

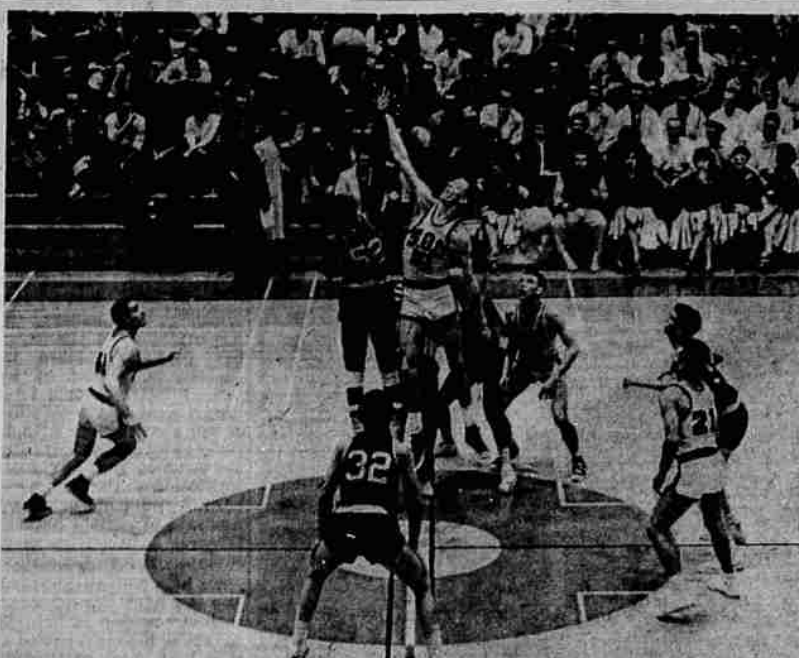
Smith averaged 18.5 points per game in 10 games. Third was Portland State's Bill Turner with a 15.1 average in the same number of games. Smith retained his rebound lead, however. He has averaged 14.2 per game to lead his teammate, Bob Petersen, who has averaged 10.6 over the 10 game route.

Toby Wolf of Oregon College of Education headed the field goal accuracy department with a 53.6 percentage. Wolf had hit 30 of 56 attempts.

In second place was Mel Holmes of Eastern Oregon and Applegate was third.

Gordy Carrigan of Southern Oregon was the most accurate from the free throw line. Carrigan had dropped 28 of 33 attempts for an .848 average. Larry Eickworth of SOC and OCE's Don Habel ranked second and third.

Eastern Oregon continued to set the offensive pace in team statistics. Coach Bob Quinn's Mountaineers were averaging 71.1 per game and were shooting at a .431 clip from the field. Oregon College was the most accurate at the gift line with .648. Oregon Tech was the team rebound leader with an average of 45.3 per game.

Oregon State College, Corvallis-Oregon State's Beavers embark on what they hope will be the comeback trail in basketball here tonight, taking on fast-improving Washington State, recent conqueror of both Stanford and Seattle U.

Game time is 8 p.m., following a preliminary between the OSC Rooks (6-4) and Centalla college. The Beaver varsity goes against Idaho here Saturday night, with the Rooks facing Oregon Medical-Dental school of Portland.

Oregon State vitally needs a sweep of the series to stay in contention for the "Race to the Regionals" NCAA berth. Two losses to Oregon last week end proved costly, since former front-runner Seattle also lost twice.

Washington State and Idaho have been two of the most improved clubs in the west the last two weeks. The Cougars bumped Stanford by 20 points, and Monday upset Seattle, Idaho trounced the Chieftains, 89-70, last Saturday.

Cal Smith To Address Waltonians

Calvin L. Smith, Industrial Forestry association district forester, will give an illustrated talk Monday, Feb. 13, at the regular monthly meeting of the Jackson County chapter of the Izaak Walton League.

His subject will be "Back ground History of Development of the Timber Industry in the Douglas Fir Region."

The meeting will be at 8 p.m. at the American Red Cross building on Hawthorne ave.

Smith's colored slides will show both industrial and non-industrial tree farms where attempts are being made to bring lands back into production.

Chapter directors and Ken Denman, chairman of the organization's legislative committee have been active lately. Letters have been sent out throughout Oregon with the chapter resolution opposing proposed inclusion of the state fish commission and the state game commission in a department of natural resources.

This is proposed in Senate Bills 3 and 2.5 before the State Legislature.

Fish Pond Bill

The board also is working to get House Bill 1228 changed. The bill, relating to use of Big Butte creek waters, would amend Oregon Statute 538.430, a law which gives the City of Medford the exclusive right to use the waters of Big Butte and its tributaries for municipal purposes. An amendment was asked by the game commission so that a fish rearing pond could be developed on McNeil creek. This would not actually use up waters.

Before the bill was introduced the city asked that the words "game commission" be changed to "other parties," thus permitting other parties to impound and use waters of Big Butte and its tributaries under conditions prescribed by the city administration.

The Waltonian board is working to get the words "game commission" restored and the city is said to have adopted a neutral position.
