Portland Exposition Urged To Turn Over Property To State

Salem — (UPI) — A legislative effort has begun to press the Pacific International Livestock Exposition in Portland to hand its property over to the state.

Rep. George Annala (D-Hood River) suggested it might serve as a new site for Portland State college.

Annala urged the Joint Ways and Means Committee to, if necessary, "force" the Oregon Centennial Commission to keep its "promise" in having the land turned over.

"This has not materialized and, unless aggressively pursued, will be forgotten by all concerned and again the state will be the loser."

Annala is vice chairman of House Ways and Means.

Sen. Alfred Corbett, who was Ways and Means chairman in 1959, said he doesn't think there was a commitment to turn the property over to higher education.

But the Portland Democrat explained that the PI setup involves two corporate groups, one profit and the other non-profit. The idea is that when the profit group dissolves, the property will go to the state "eventually."

"I had hoped this would have been accomplished by now," he said.

Anthony Branderhaler, commission chairman, said all the commission can do is assist PI officials in the transfer. "They're moving as fast as they can," he said.

Federal Crackdown On Water Pollution In State Promised

Salem — (UPI) — A federal crackdown on water pollution in Oregon is promised if the legislature passes a bill proposed by the city of Portland.

and (2)-classification of the state's streams requested by Portland because "the water purity standards should not be the same throughout the state."

Leonard B. Dworsky, Northwest director of the U. S. Public Health Service's water supply and pollution program, appeared before the Senate Committee on Local Government.

He said that if SB138 was approved it would "nullify the efforts of the state's water pollution program." Then, he said the government would have to "do whatever necessary in relation to pollution in the Columbia and Willamette rivers.

The committee took no action on SB138, or on SB38, proposed by the State Sanitary Authority. It suggested a compromise be worked out.

Alexander Brown, Portland city attorney, labeled the authority's legislation as "utopian."

Harold Wendel, chairman of the authority, charged "... Portland has found more ways to find delays than we thought conceivable."

Difference Noted Brown said the primary differences between the two bills were: (1)—The matter of stability. The city would like a minimum period of 20 years before the authority could order a city or corporation to construct additional sewage control facilities, once it had complied with an authority order.
