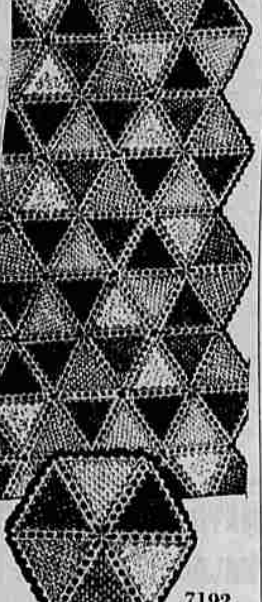

Family Council

Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychologist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a woman's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual case history. The Council reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Thomas B. - Her spinster aunt moved across the street and keeps popping over.

Antoinette B. - We've all been close, and now she's excited about my coming baby.

Thomas B. - Toni and I married late in life. I'm 40 and she's 36, so naturally we're thrilled and excited about the baby we expect in six months.

But there's a third party who wants to share the excitement with us, every step of the way. This is Toni's aunt, who just took an apartment in the building opposite ours. You'd think she was having this child, the way she's reading up on pregnancy and keeping up a blow-by-blow investigation.

I know Aunt Lottie has always felt particularly close to Toni, whose mother is dead. But there comes a time when she must look on and just love Toni at a distance. I want her to slow up in her interest and enthusiasm.

She must remember that it's our home and our baby. She'll be the Great-Aunt, not its midwife or proxy-mother!

Antoinette B. - Because my mother was the oldest and Aunt Lottie the youngest of a big family, my aunt and I are only ten years apart in age. She's always been more like an admiring big sister to me, than a stiff aunt.

Before I was married, we shared a small apartment. It was natural for her to want to stay near me, so she found rooms across the street. I understand her elation about my condition, and I wish Tom didn't resent it as an intrusion upon our privacy.

In a way, Aunt Lottie identifies herself with me. And since she will never experience childbirth herself, she's satisfied to have the next best thing - a share of my sensations during the process. It's an exciting, wondrous period, and I'm amazed myself at the miracle of it all. I'm glad to be able to impart some of this awe to Aunt Lottie.

The Council: As long as it's only the "awe" and not the details of her private life that Antoinette imparts, Tom hasn't much of a case. If this is as close as a devoted aunt will ever get to hearing the subjective story of how a baby is born, Tom should be proud to be co-author of the confidential expose.

We must assume that Toni is circumspect in her revelations, and that Aunt Lottie's curiosity is not morbid but wholesome and legitimate. Then Tom's objections reveal two natural fears: the invasion of his home by a close (in all senses) relative, and Aunt Lottie's over-involvement in the life of the expected baby.

Toni can allay these fears. Aunt Lottie seems sensible and sensitive enough to respect the sanctity of the new little family, and Toni can "arrange" visiting hours so as not to impinge on Toni's plans and wishes. Also, once the baby arrives, Aunt Lottie's role becomes analogous to that of a good grandmother - i.e., mother's helper, friend or fan, but not usurper! Toni can assure Tom of that.

Our word to Tom, then, is relax. In your great joy, you're in danger of becoming over-possessive, fearing that it may vanish. But in taking Aunt Lottie along as a hitchhiker on this side-trip she missed, you're giving her - to paraphrase Shakespeare - "that which not subtracts from you, and makes her rich indeed."
