

# Johnson's Private Airplane Crashes

Johnson City, Tex. — (UPI) — The only persons aboard. Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson's private Conquest airplane crashed Sunday night seven miles from Johnson's IJB ranch, killing two pilots.

## 'Travel Gap' Plan On Senate Agenda

Washington — (UPI) — The Senate called up for debate today the administration-backed proposal to close the "travel gap" causing a \$1 billion a year overseas drain on U.S. gold reserves.

The bill has the bipartisan sponsorship of 29 senators, including Commerce Committee Chairman Warren G. Magnuson (D-Wash.). A similar measure passed the Senate last year, but died in the House.

It calls for establishment of a \$5 million Office of International Travel within the Commerce department to be headed by an assistant secretary.

The function of the new agency would be to lure foreign tourists — and their money — to American vacation spots through a "hard sell" promotional campaign.

## Portland Students Picket Consulate

Portland — (UPI) — Members of a Portland organization entitled "Portland Students for Peace" picketed the British consulate here Saturday.

The pickets described their action as being in sympathy with anti-polaris missile demonstrations being carried out in England.

Demonstrations were held in Scotland and England Saturday against location of polaris-missile firing American submarines in a Scottish coastal inlet.

## Stocks Brisk in Early Dealings

New York — (UPI) — Stocks held their ground after a firm start in brisk first hour dealings today.

Prices in the auto group ranged from unchanged on Ford to 1/4 higher on Chrysler. Steels were narrow with prices running between 1/4 point loss for Republic and a 1/2 point gain for U. S. Steel. Rail shares held close to prior closing levels without feature.

Westinghouse lost 1/4 and GE opened 1/4 lower on a 10,000 share block among the electric equipments. Marquardt up 2 and Northrop ahead 1 1/2 highlighted the airfrats.

## Oregon Dunes Bill

# Limitations Placed on Power To Acquire Lands for National Seashore Development

There are several limitations on this power to acquire lands. The first is that no improved property could be acquired during the first year after enactment of the bill. The bill then contains this language:

"Thereafter such authority shall be suspended with respect to all improved property in any county in which the seashore is situated during all times when such county shall have in force and applicable to such property a duly adopted, valid zoning bylaw approved by the secretary in accordance with the provisions of section 5" which describe the function of the advisory board of local residents.

### Shall Suspend Authority

"The secretary's authority to acquire property shall be suspended for property used for commercial or industrial purposes during any period when such use is permitted by the secretary and during the pendency of the first application for such permission made to the secretary if such application is made before the seashore is declared established."

The term "improved property" is defined as a detached, one-family dwelling whose construction was started before the first of this year, together with the land on which it is situated. At least three acres of the land could not be taken by the government, but the government could acquire any beach or waters and adjacent shore land to provide public access.

The zoning bylaw, to meet with federal approval, "shall be designed to:

"1. Prohibit the commercial and industrial use, other than that which may be permitted by the secretary of all property within the boundaries of the seashore of participating counties.

"2. By means of acreage, frontage, setback requirements, public notices of zoning, variances and exceptions and other necessary provisions promoting in the seashore the purpose of the act."

### May Grant Exceptions

Exceptions or variance to the zoning code may be granted by the secretary. Once a property owner qualifies, he can request a certificate from the Interior Department stipulating that the secretary's authority to acquire property within the park boundaries "has been suspended" with respect to that property.

In the event that zoning codes are not invoked, any owner of improved property could retain the right of use and occupancy of the property for noncommercial residential purposes for 25 years, or for the rest of the lives of the owners or until all their surviving children have reached 21 years of age. In such cases, the government would pay the owner the fair market value of the property when it is acquired; and the occupant could sub-lease the dwelling, but he would not have to pay the government any rent for staying on.

The bill also prescribes that payments in lieu of taxes shall be paid to the counties or other local taxing bodies to compensate for any loss of taxable real estate. Private property covered by zoning bylaws would remain on the tax rolls.

### Water Withdrawal Allowed

Withdrawal of ground water from the dunes and surface water from the lakes would also be permitted, if it didn't impair the scenic seashore park.

Mrs. Neuberger's office said she made a number of revisions in the bill to accommodate the expressed suggestions of Gov. Mark Hatfield, notably the language protecting the International Paper company's authority to pipe effluent to the sea through a park land.

She said she would be glad to have co-sponsors from the Oregon congressional delegation, but she did not enlist their support in advance of introducing her bill.

### Estimated 35,000 Acres

The park would embrace an estimated 35,000 acres. The boundaries are similar to those set forth in earlier bills. Excluded from the park would be a tree farm operated by Crown-Zellerbach near Talikentch lake, unless the land was no longer used for sustained-yield timber management. In that event, it could be acquired as an addition to the park.

Siltcoos and Woahink lakes

would be included in the park.

No cost estimate was available, for the price of property acquisition would depend upon whether or not zoning codes are set up. Mrs. Neuberger's office recalled that an

initial estimate by the Park Service put the cost at \$2 to \$3 million.

If zoning bylaws are adopted, this would minimize cost by eliminating improved property from the private property that the government would acquire.
