

Three Appear in Circuit Court

Imposition of sentence was suspended for three years for Joyce Lee Ann Johnson, 19, of 204 South Grape st., in Jackson county circuit court Tuesday.

She pleaded guilty to charges of forgery. Brian Mullen was appointed her attorney Thursday, and the case was continued.

William S. Warren, 2532 Table Rock rd., was sentenced to two years, eight months in the Oregon state prison for obtaining personal benefit under false pretenses. He had pleaded guilty to the charges.

Warren is charged with pretending to Regal Service Stations that he was authorized to charge \$62.75 in purchases to the credit card of Heavy Haulers, Dallas, Tex.

French Scientists Recover Capsule

Colomb Bechar, Sahara - French scientists successfully recovered a capsule containing a rat that was fired to an undisclosed altitude today aboard a rocket, officials announced.

It was not known immediately whether the rat was alive or dead.

Official sources said the container was recovered 27 miles from the launching pad by means of a radar-spotting system and a helicopter.

The helicopter brought the capsule back to the rocket-launching base near this West African desert market town.

Grants Pass Man, Son Die in Wreck

Weed, Calif. - (UPI) - An Oregon man and his 7-year-old son were killed Tuesday in a three-car accident which injured three other persons.

The dead were identified as Gordon Willard Ring, 44, of Grants Pass, and his son, Dennis, Ring's wife, Hilda, was critically injured. Also injured were Mrs. Helen Nicodemus, 53, and Oliver F. Fredrickson, 51, both of Dunsmuir, Calif.

Highway patrolmen said Mrs. Nicodemus's car bumped the rear of another vehicle and sideswiped Ring's auto, which was heading in the opposite direction on Highway 99. Ring's car hurtled down a 30-foot embankment.

House Committee Tackles Problem of Extra Jobless Pay

Washington - (UPI) - The House Ways and Means Committee started Tuesday to pound out a final version of legislation to speed extra jobless pay benefits to the nation's unemployed.

The committee, led by Rep. Wilbur D. Mills (D-Ark.), was expected to complete its work on President Kennedy's emergency request within a few days. House action may come early next week.

The administration bills, which are labeled as anti-recession measures, would provide \$950 million for additional unemployment compensation to three million jobless workers whose benefits have either run out or will expire during the next year.

Up to 13 weeks of extra payments would be authorized, depending on eligibility in the various states. Employers would pay the cost of the program through higher taxes.

The legislation also would provide \$350 million in federal-state public assistance for needy children of the unemployed.

Kennedy said the program would give the economy a big shot in the arm as well as help the jobless.

The President proposed the one-year program be financed by raising the taxable wage base from \$3,000 to \$4,800 but chances are the committee will not go along with this.

Instead, it was likely a temporary boost in the 3.1 percent federal payroll tax would be approved. The administration has promised it would not make the matter a major issue.

The President also asked Congress to give the extra benefits to workers who exhausted their regular unemployment compensation in the period from Oct. 31, 1960, to April 1, 1962.

However, organized labor wants the starting date shoved back to last May, which it says more accurately reflects the beginning of the current recession.

Kennedy has said he would go along with setting the date at last June 30 if the committee favors the move - and it probably will. This would add another \$40 million and 125,000 workers to the programs originally proposed.

Detained Witnesses Subject of Bill

Salem - (UPI) - Rep. Bob R. Chappel (R-Portland) has introduced a bill that would provide payments of \$7.50 a day to any person held in a county jail or otherwise detained as a witness in a court action.

Present law provides \$1.50 per day. Chappel, a Portland detective, said this would correct situations similar to the recent incident in Jackson county where material witnesses were held for "prolonged periods at \$1.50 a day solely because they witnessed the commission of a crime."

He said he is introducing a total of 14 bills to help reduce the crime rate in Oregon.

Public Said Too Tolerant of Evil

San Francisco - (UPI) - California Attorney General Stanley Mosk said Tuesday the American public is too tolerant of evil in big business, big labor and big rackets.

He told the San Francisco Exchange Club that increasing crime statistics reflects a "moral breakdown" among the populace.

"Padded expense accounts, income tax dodges, business sleight of hand are all too common," Mosk said. "When a juvenile steals \$50 from a supermarket it is considered a crime of rather large magnitude - but when an employee gouges \$50 a month on his expense account, it's thought of as just clever."

Bureau Warns People of Concentrated Sea Water

Persons who suffer from arthritis and other ailments should not expect to obtain any relief through adding sea water to their diets, according to Don McNeil, manager of the Medford Chamber of Commerce.

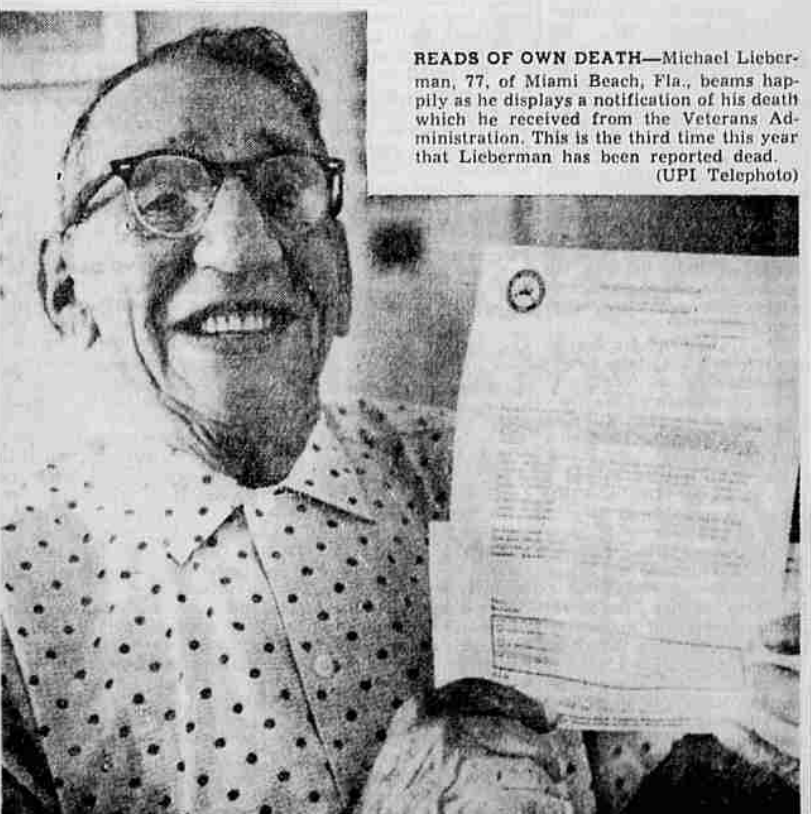
Several firms in various sections of the country have advertised concentrated sea water as being beneficial to persons suffering from arthritis, cancer, diabetes, loss of virility, and other conditions, he noted.

McNeil stated that according to the National Better Business Bureau, sea water "is an insignificant source of minerals" for any person whose diet may need supplementation. According to the bureau, nutritional authorities state that other minerals known to be essential in human nutrition "are so widely distributed in both plant and animal foods that any reasonable diet which supplies vitamin and protein needs would normally cover the needs for these minerals also."
