Pin Tournament To Aid Hospital

A three-game singles tournament for benefit of the Crippled Children's Hospital at Eugene will be conducted Sunday, Feb. 26 and March 5, at Medford Bowling lanes.

Sponsor is Delta Omega chapter of Epsilon Sigma Alpha international. There will be men's and women's divisions. Handicap will be based on three-fourths of the difference between current average and 200. Highest current average for 15 games or more must be used but, if he has no current average, a bowler may use last year's average for 21 games or more.

One-third of the bowling entry fee will be sent to the hospital.

The three games will be rolled across six alleys with squads every hour on the hour with not more than two bowlers to each lane.
