Tunisian Leader To Meet de Gaulle

Tunis, Tunisia—(UPI)—Tunisian President Habib Bourguiba said Thursday night he hoped his meeting with President Charles de Gaulle next Monday would lead to peace talks between France and the Moslem Algerian nationalists.

Bourguiba, whose country shelters the Algerian "provisional government" and rebel troops, will confer with de Gaulle at Rambouillet Castle, the French leader's official country residence outside Paris.

Bourguiba said the fact de Gaulle invited him for exploratory talks—knowing he was a supporter of the rebel regime—indicates "the obstacles which blocked direct peace negotiations in the past have been surmounted."
