

CRATER CLIPS WINGS OF PELS 68-64 IN STUNNING HOOP UPSET

Central Point — That high flying bird, the Klamath Pelican, got more basketball Friday night than either his beak or his belly can hold.

Crater high's doughy cagers aren't going to any state tournament this year but they'll certainly be remembered. They earned their claim to fame in 1961 here Friday. The blazing Comets of Central Point, with heart, hustle and torrid shooting, scorched the feathers and made them fly.

Their accomplishment: they beat the Klamath Union High School Pelicans, Oregon's No. 1 rated hoop aggregation, 68 to 64 in a Southern Oregon conference game.

The strictly unranked Comets, out of the district chase and playing the role of prestige spoilers, in an heroic effort stealing the Oregon spotlight, did what no other conference member has done and what no Klamath Pelican had accomplished in 17 previous seasons.

But, the sizzling, ballhawking Crater hoopmen made the Pels fight for the ball and consistently beat them to other free balls during the night.

Klamath Falls had the margin in field goals, 27 to 23, but not in accuracy as the Comets outlaid the also hot Pels 54.8 to 52.9. At the free throw line the Crater band outscored its highly regarded adversary 22 to 10.

Two Score 21. The Comets, Alvarez and Higinbotham in particular, hit from long range and their workman-like ballhandling opened up the core of the Pel defense for driving shots.

Alvarez, with 21 points and Edwards 13. For Klamath Falls Bruce Brickner put in 17 counters and Kent Hunsaker 12. Brickner, back in action after a siege with mumps, pulled down 18 rebounds and Garry Patzke 14 as the Pels retrieved from the boards 49 times to Crater's 29. Edwards had 11 snafus for Crater.

Crater, with Edwards goaling on an Alvarez assist, and with Alvarez putting in three free heaves, broke from a 51-all tie to lead 56 to 51 with less than 5 1/2 minutes to play. Then Ray Taylor hit close in

for KF and was fouled by Higinbotham. He sank the free point. Blehn came through with a driving layup for 56 each with 4:47 remaining on the clock.

Ahead To Stay. Higinbotham's long push shot put Crater on top again but Palmer countered with a jumping swing shot to get just under four minutes to go.

The score was 58 apiece. A rebound by Bruce Brickner put Klamath in front 60 to 58 with 3:18 left. With 2:03 showing, Alvarez potted a jump from back of the circle for a 60-all standing. The Comets regained the lead with 1:46 to play on two free throws by Mike Glines. Hunsaker sank Crater held leads of 18 to 16 and 34 to 31 at the quarter and half. The game was tied at 49 at the conclusion of three panels.

On the scoring of Alvarez, Tom White and Edwards, the Comets moved out from the half-time margin to get their first six-point bulge of the evening at 43 to 37 with the third quarter slightly more than half played. Brickner, Palmer and Taylor netted field buckets to bring the Pelicans even.

Edwards' long push from the side made 45 to 43 for Crater. Taylor's free loss and Palmer's basket off a fast break gave the KF club its first lead since the first quarter at 46 to 45 with two minutes to play in the third stanza. White, from the free line, made it 46 apiece but Hunsaker, a 10-footer from the side at 1:34 for 62 each. Then Alvarez put the Central Point school ahead for good.

Brickner netted the ball from the side of the slot for 48 to 46 Klamath. Higinbotham and Taylor traded free shots and Jeff Anhorn brought the Comets even at 49 with a pusher.

Alvarez opened the final canto for Crater with a jump from the side but Blehn's long two-hand set shot made it 51-all. None of the Klamath Falls leads were by more than two points while Crater held gaps of three and four as well as five and six.

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
