

## Medfordite Wins Jump

Government Camp - (UPI) - Lenny Johnson of the Cascade Ski club won class A competition and six Washington skiers took first place honors to highlight the Annual Pacific Northwest Ski association jumping championships here.

Johnson, a Medford court reporter, had jumps of 180 and 178 feet, while compiling 214.3 points to win the class A event.

Orav Ulland, Harald Ring and Jan Garretson, all representing Seattle's Kongsberg club, won titles in veterans, junior expert and junior novice events. Ulland had jumps of 126 and 132 feet and compiled 205.4 points. Ring jumped 128 and 137 feet and had 207.9 points while Garretson had jumps of 92 and 94 feet and 196.8 points.

Koll Hagen of the Washington athletic club in Seattle took up honors in B-1 competition with jumps of 146 and 153 feet.

## Wooden Shoe Trims Coquille For AAU District 5 Title

Wooden Shoe of Medford, weary in a marathon of basketball, caught a fresh burst of energy in the stretch and rallied to defeat Coos-Curry of Klamath last night in the championship finale of the District 5 AAU basketball tournament at Hedrick gym here. Score in the title-deciding game of the double elimination was 92 to 71.

The restaurant - sponsored team, which has run second in the Southern Oregon Independent league, gained its crown the hard way. Wooden Shoe had to play four games yesterday, three of them in consecutive order.

Coquille whipped the Shoe 71 to 63 in a late morning game of the championship flight, dropping the restaurant aggregation into the losers' bracket. Wooden Shoe then beat the Drain Merchants 89 to 60 and Coquille 90 to 52 in afternoon conflicts. Because neither of the two finalists

had suffered a second loss, they had to play again. The evening, tussle thereby was the third game of the day for Coquille.

### State Meet Shot

With the mantle goes the right to enter the Oregon AAU tournament which opens next Friday at Hermiston. The team is looking for sponsorship in the way of final aid to help meet expenses for the trip.

Losers' bracket play yesterday also saw Drain barely nip Roseburg 73 to 72 and Round Up of Klamath Falls top Drain 82 to 72 in overtime. Klamath Falls then was disqualified for using a player under an assumed name. It, instead of Drain, otherwise, would have played Wooden Shoe.

The Medford entry trailed Coquille by 56 to 61 midway through the final half of the concluding game. It partly closed the gap, lagged at 59 to 65 and then caught the coast team at 65-all on a Dave D'Olivio pusher with 6:27 left. Keith Johnson scored on a fast break to make it 67 to 65 with six minutes to play and Wooden Shoe was ahead to stay. It jumped to 75 to 65 on some fast breaking and adept team play. Don Adams hit a goal for Coquille with four minutes left. Then Wooden Shoe extended to 92 to 67 to pull completely out of reach.

Coquille was the hotter shooting team for most of the contest and particularly was effective from long range with Terry Woods, Don Adams and Don Nelson swishing the net. The coast area club was on top most of the time during the first half although six lead changes took place. Coos-Curry had 39 to 36 halftime advantage.

Wooden Shoe didn't catch up until 12 1/2 minutes before the final buzzer. Three free shots by Keith Johnson on a technical and a personal foul made it 52-all. Dale Bates' underhand lay-in made it 74 to 52 for the Medford team. Adams on a long shot and Gary Johnson on a steal put Coquille in front but Keith Johnson's long push tied it at 56-all. Nelson's jumper and free toss and Duane Brady's goal took it to 61 to 56 for Coquille.

D'Olivio Ties  
Gene Parent put in a free toss and Dick Puhl a free throw for WS but Coos-Curry got the momentum six points apiece to 59 on shots by Gary Johnson and Bud Grant. D'Olivio connected for Wooden Shoe and Hollingsworth added two gifts. Then D'Olivio knotted the game.

Firing by Lloyd Hoffine, D'Olivio, Keith Johnson and Bates kept the Wooden Shoe within striking distance in the early second half. D'Olivio had 20 points for the game and Hollingsworth and Johnson each 18. Nelson hit 18 for Coquille, Adams 16 and Woods 14.

The Shoe got ahead at the start and stayed there in its afternoon game with Coos-Curry. It got its fast break working, had some good driving on the part of Johnson and Bates, had some ball stealing on the part of Johnson, had some good rebounding by D'Olivio and Hollingsworth, had some key shots by Hoffine, got a commanding ad-

vantage and let non-starters carry much of the burden to conserve strength for the night engagement.

Hollingsworth had 16 points for WS and Grant 14 for Coquille.

Drain proved a scrappy, hard - trying bunch against Wooden Shoe but the restaurant built up a 47 to 30 margin in the first half and expanded control in the second. High scoring in this tangle for the host club was by Parent with 18 and Ken Vannice with 15. Dennis Olsen had 13, and Jim Swearingen and Dick Blomberg each had 12 for Drain, the same as Puhl for Shoe.

Woods with 29 markers, Adams with 15 and Brady with 14 sparked Coquille in the morning game with the eventual champs. Wooden Shoe had D'Olivio and Bates with 13 apiece and Hollingsworth with 12. Erratic play and inability to hit the hoop were costly to Wooden Shoe in the morning. The home club did lead 38 to 33 at halftime.

Klamath Falls against Drain led the Merchants 39 to 27 at the half and topped 55 to 40. Then Denny Olsen sparked a comeback. His basket tied the game at 65-all. Jack Weaver put the Merchants in front 66 to 65 but Ron Owings tied it with 21 seconds left to bring about an overtime period. Klamath took charge in the last 3 1/2 minutes of the extra.

Olsen had 21 points for Drain and Weaver 17. A player listed as Larry Wetter scored 18 for Klamath.

Roseburg's Bob Steele had the tournament single game high of 38 points yesterday morning but it was not enough as his team fell to Drain. His shooting was offset by 25 points by Virgil Merrill and 18 by Olsen. K and S led at halftime 41 to 35.

The tournament opened Saturday with Wooden Shoe beating Klamath Falls 75 to 68 and Drain 111 to 70. Coquille licking Roseburg 68 to 59. Wooden Shoe played six games in the two-day tourney.

Klamath Falls took the team diadem with 148 points. Grants Pass was second with 141 and Medford third with 136. Crater scored 75 and Ashland 15. Klamath's Pellons and GP each won five individual titles.

Fields defeated Fred Stillwell, Klamath Falls, in his conclusion. The pin at 17 seconds of the first round, was the fastest of the meet. Funston defeated Bob Pfandner, Grants Pass, 4-1, in his finale.

Barber's finalist victim was Milo Crumrine, Klamath Falls. The decision was 6-0. Four men took second places for Medford, giving the Tornado six berths in the Oregon state tournament at Corvallis this week end. They were Bill Owens, 130, who defeated Pete McSwain, Klamath, 8-0, in the scrap for second and third positions; Larry Gunn, 137, who beat Bill Charley, also Medford, 8-1; Chuck Holt, 168, who was 5-2 victor over Mick Walker, Grants Pass, and Chuck Shaw, 191, who defeated Terry O'Sullivan, Medford, in overtime.

Crater gained three state spots when Dave White, 123, and Dennis Fisher, 136, garnered seconds. White beat

Sherd Duncan, Klamath Falls, and Fisher was 7-6 winner over Dan Eddy, Medford.

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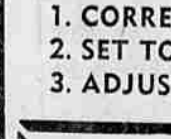
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
