Skin Cancers

One of the commonest troubles that aging persons must constantly be on the watch for is skin cancer. There is no excuse for letting one grow to a size where it metastasizes into the glands of the neck, and later all through the body. Fifty-five years ago, when I was a young doctor, I used to see many old people with what were called "rodent ulcers" because they gnawed the face. Some of them were as big as half a dollar and ate into the nose or an ear or an eyelid. Thank goodness, I no longer see such big ulcers, but every so often I see a small, scabby patch which occasionally ulcerates and then heals over for a while. This is a skin cancer, and now is the time to have it burned off.

The thing can be destroyed by hot sparks—in a few seconds—and the scar will hardly be visible. In the last 30 years I must have had at least two dozen of these little skin cancers destroyed on my face. I used to go to see my dear old friend, Dr. Paul O'Leary who would inject under the scabby place a drop of procaine and then, in a few seconds, he would burn the thing off. Many people will still go to a cancer quack or some old woman to have an arsenic paste put on, but this is often bad because it can dig a deep
