## Actor John Payne Struck by Auto

New York — (UPI) — Veteran film and TV actor John Payne took a turn for the worse today at Roosevelt hospital where he was taken after being hit by a car on a Manhattan street.

A hospital spokesman said that Payne's condition had deteriorated since he was brought there Wednesday night with fractures of the lower left leg and numerous deep scalp and face cuts. He was on the operating table for several hours while surgeons set his leg and sewed up his wounds.

Payne's condition at first was described as "good" but it became "critical" this morning, Payne, 48, seemed mainly worried about whether his handsome face was scarred.

"How's my face?" he asked. "Is it badly cut?"

Doctors promised Payne that his face would not be scarred. Payne was hit by a car Wednesday night as he was crossing Madison ave., a block from the hotel where he was staying. He was hurled onto the hood, his head smashing the windshield and his body denting the hood.

The driver of the car, Bernard T. Selz, 21, New York, a financial research analyst, told police he did not see Payne in time to stop. Selz was questioned and released.

## Congress Blamed For Navy Waste

Washington — (UPI) — Sen. Stuart Symington (D-Mo.) said today Congress was partly to blame for the Navy's purchase of \$668 million worth of faulty planes, aircraft engines and radar.

This "waste in the management of our defenses should not be blamed entirely on the services," Symington said in a prepared Senate speech. "Congress itself shares a grave responsibility for the 'present antique organization structure of the Pentagon.'"

Symington, who has been making a series of Senate speeches about similar military waste, said the Navy spent \$417 million on the F7U twin-jet, all-weather fighter before canceling the rest of its order when 34 of the 304 produced had crashed.

Another plane was found "inadequate for the mission assigned," he said, but only after 149 of the 389 ordered by the Navy were produced. This error in ordering the T2V training plane cost \$139 million, he said.

In another case, the Navy failed to halt production of the P5M radar system, he said, "even after evidence of unreliability had accumulated." He said this cost the government \$51.6 million.

## House Committee Votes School Bill

Salem — (UPI) — The House Education Committee Wednesday voted out "do pass" a Senate bill severing the final tie between the Gladstone and Milwaukie Union high school districts.

The do pass recommendation was unanimous. Chairman Tom Monaghan (D-Milwaukie) explained that although Gladstone has approved its own administrative district, Gladstone voters can still vote on the Milwaukie school budget through next July 1.

This bill, already passed by the Senate, would prevent this.

REDS OFFER AID  
Jakarta, Indonesia — (UPI) — Three Communist bloc nations have agreed to build cement plants in Indonesia, making the nation self-sufficient in cement production, it was learned today. The Soviet Union, Poland, and Czechoslovakia will build the plants, first of which will be in operation by the end of 1961.

## Willamette Theft Ring Smashed

Salem — (UPI) — Police said Wednesday they have smashed a four county burglary and fencing ring in the lower Willamette Valley. Eleven persons were in custody.

The ring has been operating for about the last three months between Salem and Portland, according to Salem Police Capt. Glenn Bowman.

Burglaries in Marion, Polk and Yamhill counties are involved. Seven persons were arrested here and four in Portland.

Bowman said the four persons in custody in Portland were allegedly fencing cigarettes and other merchandise stolen in the valley.

The final arrest was made Wednesday. Bowman said "well over" 1,000 cartons of cigarettes were involved along with several thousand dollars in television sets, radios, guns and other items.
