The meet will be held at the Multnomah Athletic club and will have contestants from all over the northwest, with at least one national record holder.

Representing the local team will be nine boys who are entered in 13 events. In the 11-12 group Phil Taylor will swim the 50-yard free style, 50-yard breast stroke and the 200 individual medley. Kirby Lusk and Riley McHugh will swim the 50 free, the 50 back, and the 50 breast stroke. Dennis Carson will swim the 50 free and the 50 back. These four boys will enter as a team in the two relays for this age group.

Taylor holds the Columbia Basin league record in the 50 free at :28.5, set in the recent CBL Northwest championships held at Vancouver, Wash.
