Multiple Sclerosis

Multiple sclerosis is a chronic disease of the nervous system. The first symptoms show up usually when the person is somewhere between 18 and 35 years of age. First, there may be a temporary weakness or numbness of the patient's arm, and sometimes quick improvement following giving of ACTH, a hormone derived from the pituitary gland. There is a Multiple Sclerosis Society (257 4th Ave., New York, N.Y.) that is helping to fund research on the disease. Already, a disease that resembles multiple sclerosis can be produced in animals. some disturbance of vision. Usually, after a while, the symptom disappears, and the diagnosis may be just nerves. But later other symptoms come. Fortunately, in a considerable percentage of the cases the person is not incapacitated.

Years ago in Rochester, Minn., a census was taken of all of the people in the city who were known to have multiple sclerosis and, as I remember the figure, it was found that even after 25 years, half of the people were at work. Hence, the person who is found to have this disease should not become panicky. His or her disease may advance very slowly.

What causes the loss of function in some of the nerves of the body is the loss here and there of the little insulating coat that goes around each nerve. Unfortunately, as yet, the exact mode of production of the disease is not so well known that we doctors can devise a cure, but knowledge is constantly being gathered. More and more evidence indicates that the insulating coat of the nerves is injured in a sort of allergic process in which the person becomes sensitized to his own nerve tissue.
